

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Competitive Bellringing

Bellringing contests are called Striking Competitions as the ringing is judged on the regularity of the sounds made when the clappers strike the bells. During the



summer Surrey Association hold a Striking Challenge in which participating bands compete in a local league holding Home and Away matches with other towers. In September the Guildford Guild holds an annual 6-bell Striking Competition, open to all in the district and this year Ockley are the host tower giving us a slight home advantage.

Good striking takes a lot of practice, especially the habit of listening to each blow. As well as ringing your bell you must keep the space between you and the adjacent bells evenly spaced.

At normal ringing speed bells swing full circle in about 2 seconds; with 6 bells striking evenly there is a third of a second gap between successive bells. If one bell is too fast or slow by 10% of that interval, it can just be detected; if the deviation is 25% it is very noticeable. So for good striking every blow needs to be within about a twentieth of a second of its correct position. This is amazing precision considering the weight of the bell, with only a rope to control it.

The object of the competition is to ring a piece; either a set number of minutes of call changes or a doubles or minor method of similar length, all the while trying to strike the bells correctly. An independent judge sits outside, so that the identity of the band is not known, and listens to each entry and records all the faults. At the end there is a general summing up and the band with the least number of faults is declared the winner. In any event it is a social occasion and the feedback is invaluable in improving the overall striking.

Bellringing is an art which has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years. It is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, friendship, a challenge of wits and skill which gives great satisfaction when it goes right. If you would like to find out more, please come along. 

Parish Councils are the first tier (grass roots level) of local government - not to be confused with parochial church councils and ecclesiastical parishes. They are elected corporate bodies and are responsible for areas known as civil parishes. They serve electorates, are independently elected and raise their own precept (a form of council tax - shown on your council tax account).

Annual Assembly

At the Annual Assembly held in May the two new parish councillors, Amanda Barclay and James Lee-Steere, were welcomed. Two councillors had not stood for re-election - Gordon Lee-Steere (who had joined 1976) and Richard Herbert (who had joined 2004). They were thanked for their service to the parish council. The new MV District Councillor, Helyn Clack, was also welcomed to the meeting. She is also the Surrey County Councillor for the village.

Barry Thorne presented the Annual Report to those at the meeting - he highlighted the following matters that the parish council had considered during the year: parish magazine - the change with the church parish boundaries had meant that the magazine would not have been able to continue in its current form. A team was set up to produce a new magazine so that communication could continue in and around the village. It is now delivered free of charge to 700 homes in Ockley, Forest Green, Oakwood Hill and Walliswood plus 200 to businesses, pubs, churches and village halls. Thanks to A Hardy and his team for all the work they had carried out to get this new magazine up and running.

Neighbourhood Development Plan - the Ockley NDP remains on hold as it must be in line with the Future MV Plan. The parish council wants to see more affordable homes built in the village and for them to be properly affordable. Discussions are being held with various organisations regarding such housing for the village.

school buildings at Ockley - the application for the buildings to be registered as an Asset of Community Value was refused. A request for the decision to be re-considered returned the same decision.

play area at the village hall - the new dinosaur slide had been officially opened by SCCouncillor H Clack. New swings had also been installed and fencing replaced. car park at Ockley station - as a charge for parking had now been introduced the number of cars being parked at the station had dropped. As there were now usually spaces available all day the parish council had decided not to proceed with plans for additional parking. Speedwatch in the village - new camera systems were being investigated for use in the village and further traffic calming measures were to be discussed with SCC. A number of new recruits were awaiting police training so that they could join the team rota.

He thanked the Ockley Society for continuing to provide the ever popular events in the village; the Speedwatch Team for time spent on the side of the A29 monitoring the speed of the traffic then inputting data to send to Surrey Police. He also thanked parish councillors and clerk for the time that they give to parish matters during the year.

SCCouncillor H Clack had sent through a report for the meeting. She stated that she had a high regard for parish councils and appreciated all the work that the parish council had carried out during the year. She highlighted that the county council was going through a lot of changes with many challenges regarding funding; a new Chief Executive Officer had been recruited and a new County Council Leader welcomed. She noted that there had been £20 million additional investment for pothole repairs after a harsh winter period.

<u>Parishioners</u> raised concerns about repairs to potholes not always being as successful as they should be. Positive aspects of the community were highlighted but concerns raised as to attracting more families to the village to keep the community alive. It was noted that all those currently living in the village must ensure that the community involvement and spirit was maintained.

Financial information

The financial information for the year 2018-19 will be on the parish council website and on the notice board at the end of School Lane.

The precept for that year was £18,000 with some grant money also being received. Expenditure for the year included sums for the purchase of the slide and swings for the play area, general maintenance / mowing around the Green and the play area, insurance, audit, hire of premises (including part payment for Post Office at the pavilion), traffic survey, subscriptions, clerk's salary and admin costs.

OKEWOOD HILL, OCKLEY & FOREST GREEN SUMMER SHOW

Preparations are well advanced for the Show on the 10th August. Most of the stalls have been booked as have the animals including the owls and the Surrey Union Hounds.

The Morris Dancers are also booked (different ones to previous years). We have already had some donations but if anybody is feeling generous there is always room for more!

The vintage vehicles are being organised along with the vintage farm machinery.

The theme this year for the children's art is dinosaurs which promises to be a big favourite. We have also been generously lent a dinosaur footprint found at Pondhead Farm, when the pond was being excavated, so many thanks to Erica Lucas.

Put the date in your diaries. The Committee is praying for good weather!

The Garden in Summer

July! It's Summertime. And according to the song, "the livin' is easy". We certainly hope so. But whether or not the "fish are jumping", and whether or not "your Daddy's rich, and your Mum is good-lookin", it's a time of year to sit back. Relax, enjoy, and admire your own garden - and gain inspiration from others.

Your baskets and containers will be at their best now. Worth all that effort! Time to feel smug. But now's a good time to make a mental note of things you see elsewhere which inspire you for next year (we have come across 'Black Velvet' petunias which are stunning, especially if juxtaposed with 'Vanilla White' surfinias or deep pink pelargoniums.)

Our borders may be a little past their very best – the exuberance of May and June takes some beating: the acid green foliage of euphorbia, the foamy alchemilla whose leaves collect raindrops like pearls, the burgeoning flowers of clematis montana, wisteria, weigela, and the first fresh blooms of roses. But Sweet peas should still be looking good now. Cut them regularly (if you don't they'll set seed and stop flowering). Deadhead roses and feed with tomato fertilizer to keep them flowering. (Not all roses are bred to be repeat flowerers, but many varieties will keep going til Autumn if you treat them right).

The fabulous purple alliums, and the evocative scent of wild garlic in woodlands are all memories that we can file away as inspiration for next year. Looking ahead we can look forward to stronger, more dramatic colours: Dahlias (Bishop of Llandaff is a stunner) and Crocosmias (Lucifer) for example.

In the vegetable department, aim to water all your vegetable plants on a regular basis and particularly your tomatoes (OK, we know they are technically fruit, not veg!) on a consistently, feeding once a week. Also don't forget to stop cordon tomatoes by removing the main shoot. Look for the leaf that's above the fourth truss (set of developing fruit) and cut it off here. This should ensure that all the fruits ripen by the end of the season. Bush tomatoes can be left to their own devices.

Your first early Potatoes should be ready to harvest soon along with Spinach, Peas and Beans, Carrots, Salads and spring planted Onion and Garlic. Consider sowing spring cabbage, leeks and brassicas for a winter supply. Summer prune gooseberries and redcurrants.

And finally...It's RHS at Hampton Court this month. Not so smart and pristine as Chelsea, but at least you can see things. (Did you like the Chelsea Best in Show garden? We thought so...) If you don't want to brave the crowds perhaps a visit to the Okewood Ockley and Forest Green Summer Fair on Saturday 10th August is best. Check out the plant stalls in the show ground and the various vegetable exhibits in the Marquee You might even think about exhibiting your own fruit, veg or flowers yourself. A schedule and entry form should have been delivered to your door in June.

Did you know, 37 per cent of job applications are submitted on a Tuesday (abcnews.com). That's how powerful Mondays can be! But I love Mondays because it's the day I reset for the week and that reset starts with prayer.

At 10am on Mondays you'll always know where to find me: at prayers at St John the Baptist, Okewood. Usually there are around 12 of us, sometimes we've had as many as 16. Folk from all around the parish, and many who stay on for the Ministry and Mission meeting afterwards.

We pray in all different styles – in silence, out loud – using the Northumbrian Community words and structure. It's just a way of getting together with others and talking to God. There's no special skills required. I'm reminded of Sister Wendy, the nation's favourite nun who said, "Accept that God is good and that our relationship with Him is prayer and you must conclude that prayer is an act of the utmost simplicity." She's right!

I've said it's about talking to God, but - and here I also need to be better - it's also about listening. This is where being silent and sensitive to the small, inner voice is important. When we've reached out in prayer and asked for guidance or healing, we need to wait and trust. Sometimes we get feelings or impressions. Other times we get promptings: "Go and call so and so, she needs a call". Sometimes words from songs can enter your mind. When I returned from hospital recently, I prayed and was immediately reminded of a song with the refrain, "His eye is on the sparrow, and I know that he watches me." It was incredibly comforting. A word from God that he was with me. Praise him!

We also need to hear from God to know where he is leading us. Jesus said: "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me – just as the Father knows me and I know the Father – and I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that are not of this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." (John 10:14-16)

So, come and listen to God. You see, prayer can be a wonderful conversation with our Creator. On occasions, as well as blessing and comfort, you will get tough convictions: "Stop behaving in such and such a manner", "make peace with your neighbour". These can be tough directions to hear but I can guarantee that God will be patient, merciful and kind. And the only consequence I've experienced of being obedient has been a radical sense of freedom and very often subsequent blessings.

Whether or not you come to our lovely Sunday services or Monday morning prayers, I encourage you to pray. Keep checking in with "Big G" as my husband's Dad calls him. He's always there with a loving word.

He's always got your back. He gives you the dynamism and direction to a fruitful future: living life to the full.

Of course I keep praying through the week, and we get together for

a second session in Ewhurst church at 10am on Thursdays. But it's because prayer starts and surrounds the week that I always look forward to Mondays at Okewood so much.

May the Lord bless you and keep you,

I am Chris Devereux, Ockley Resident and member of the Okewood Congregation, I was recently re-elected as one of the 4 Surrey & NE Hampshire Governors of SECAmb after 3 years absence.

What does a Governor do? We meet regularly as the Board of Governors which includes elected representatives from Surrey, E & W Sussex, Kent, Brighton & Hove, Medway, plus Appointed Governors representing other Emergency Services, County Councils, Educational Establishments and charities

An NHS Governor's duties are to appoint and hold to account the non-executive directors and the chair and to represent the interests of the members of the trust and the general public in our area, this is made more difficult in that owing to data protection regulations we are unable to be told who our members are. Unlike hospital Governors whose constituency is fairly easily defined ours is County-wide.

I just scraped in this time by 2 votes so it is quite important to me to increase the local membership base.


