

# WELCOME

The WOOF magazine which 'took over' from the OOFG PPC Ockley Parish magazine on 1st January 2019 has completed its first year.

We hope you like the revised format and are pleased with the content and the new name.

It is now published 6 times a year rather than monthly BUT distributed free to all residents in the Ockley, Oakwood Hill, Walliswood and Forest Green area (it can still be received by post for those who live outside the area).

Some 400 copies of the old magazine were printed monthly with a special print run of 900 for the December issue, we are now printing 950 per issue.

lain Gutteridge continues editing each issue, with content included on a first come basis. Adverts (which essentially pay for the magazine) can be interwoven with the content rather than printed in one batch at the beginning of the year as used to be the case, which on one infamous occasion resulted in 3 copies of Barry's Bumblings appearing in one issue.

The 6 issues of the Magazine cost some £7,700; the income totalled some £8,500 so we made a small surplus of some £800.

We are totally dependent on our volunteers who distribute twice the number of magazines than used to be the case. A true sign of Community spirit.

Alan Hardy organises the distribution (and the distributers) as well as leading the organising group, Susie Pickard liaises with the advertisers and I do the accounts. In the longer term we hope to be able to return to monthly publication.

# THE GARDEN IN EARLY SPRING

On your marks... after the dark, depressing months of winter, characterised by apparently inactive gardens (and gardeners), spring is in the air. We saw a few narcissi as early as the second week in January (outside Notcutts), Snowdrops and Primulas made their usual early appearance. And a (very) few shrubs like Daphne odorata and Viburnum bodnantense have been in flower -but otherwise winter has held its grip.

In March we are teased by what is to come as early bulbs poke their way tentatively through the soil: Muscari, dwarf Iris, Scilla, Narcissus thalia make their entrance and early flowering shrubs like Camellia create a spirit of optimism and expectation. Then, as April approaches, the dramatic and rapid transformation of spring launches itself with all the energy and exuberance of a six year old on Christmas morning. The garden is zinging with the bright acid greens and yellows of Euphorbia and Golden Hop; fresh Hostas unfurl almost before your eyes; striking new growth of Acers and Maples compete with Magnolias and Azalea for attention. Every day seems to bring something new, and long forgotten plants reappear. By the middle of April Wisteria should be beginning to bloom and Roses should be putting on strong growth.

There is so much to do: plan to sow Sweet Peas, plant Potatoes, and give the lawn its first cut and a feed (treat with "MoBacter" if moss is a problem).

Think also about pruning: many shrubs need your attention soon. Roses should be pruned (HT's hard, others much less so) before the new buds break. Cornus, which should have been a real late-winter feature with its bright stems, needs to be hard-pruned around early April to promote next year's show. Sambucus needs tough treatment too (or will get out of control) but will soon repay with a mass of nearly-black, feather-like foliage. Forsythia needs to be pruned after flowering. But there are some shrubs you must absolutely not prune yet: Clematis Montana, whether white or pink, will produce a fantastic display in May – which would be lost if you pruned now. Traditional mophead hydrangeas, too, just need dead heading - don't cut into the wood or this year's flowers will be lost. Confusingly, other varieties of Hydrangea (e.g. paniculata, arborescens) can be pruned now, just as other varieties of Clematis (those which flower later) do need a prune if you are not to end up with a top heavy plant. Generalisations about when and how to prune (e.g. 'early flowering shrubs tend to require pruning straight after flowering') can be helpful but also risky, so the best advice is 'if you don't know, look it up'!

And finally, the Flower Show is just 5 months away – so plan your entries now!



Our theme this year is 'The House of Science', a nod towards the scientific links the house has to the Wedgwood family, famed for their ceramics which involved a great deal of chemistry, and also to the Darwins.

The best-known Darwin is of course Charles, but other members of the family such as his grandfather Erasmus Darwin, who was a renowned physician and naturalist, are also figures of interest. Charles's sister Caroline was a keen botanist who planted up the Rhododendron Wood, and her daughters, especially Lucy, helped their uncl



and her daughters, especially Lucy, helped their uncle Charles in some of his experiments for his final treatise on earthworms.

Our exhibitions don't stop with the Darwin/Wedgwood connections. We are looking at the science of landscape and some aspects of historic houses, and we are also investigating the kitchen science that goes into the cream teas that are a well-known draw to Leith Hill Place. We will have beautiful cake-stands made by a volunteer to help furnish the exhibition, and we are looking for realistic-looking knitted, crocheted, felted or stitched scones or cake to fill them. If you can help us, please drop your creations at the property before the end of March.

Finally, we also look at the technology used by Vaughan Williams to help him record the folk songs he heard from local people, some of which formed the basis of his best loved hymns and carols.

All the exhibitions are free with entry, and our tea room, staffed by our wonderful volunteer bakers and helpers, will be putting on the usual spread of delicious cakes and scones.

### The Pleasure of Ringing

Though not aware of it myself, it is apparently common knowledge amongst bellringers that Pilgrim's Progress, written 350 years ago, is an



allegory of a man trying to master Bob Doubles, one of the first methods a ringer learns after mastering plain hunt. In fact our newest ringers are currently working on this method.

John Bunyan was a fanatical bellringer and supposedly coined the terms Slough of Despond, Valley of Humiliation, Doubting Castle, Giant Despair and Mountain of Error with method ringing in mind.

This may give the impression that ringing is a tortuous affair but actually there is a great feeling of elation when you get it right. It does however take a lot of practice and like most things in life, the better the preparation the more likely you are to succeed. The fact that Bunyan was so keen is no surprise as there are always further challenges to meet in learning to ring more complex methods.

Sadly, although hooked on ringing Bunyan felt compelled to give it up for religious reasons. He didn't believe it to be wicked but thought that God would find his enjoyment of it to be so. He was then tormented by the pleasure he was missing.

He also gave up other pleasures such as dancing and playing a forerunner of cricket and rounders after an epiphanic moment when a voice in his head said 'Wilt thou leave they sins and go to heaven or have thy sins and go to hell?'

Bunyan missed ringing so much that he continued to visit the bell tower to watch but then became obsessed with the thought that the bells would fall upon him and this is described in Grace Abounding to the Chief of Sinners in 1666.

### TWO COUNTIES ART & CRAFTS SOCIETY

Demonstration in Mixed Media by Chris Forsey on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2019, Walliswood Village Hall

Dorking-based artist Chris trained as a graphic artist but is mostly self-taught in watercolour and acrylics and gets most inspiration in mixed media painting where he gives his imagination free reign. His main preoccupation is with atmosphere, light and weather, and he endeavours to capture the



fleeting changes these can bring to the scene. His enthusiasm for painting is very evident in his many videos and published books.

This evening Chris was to demonstrate a Dartford river scene using mostly acrylic paints and inks on mount board which had been primed with Gesso and tinted with yellow ochre. He uses Daler Rowney Cryla paints with an Acrylic medium to aid flow rather than thinning the paint with water. Chris began by placing random patches of an oil pastel over the board to make the surface interesting. Mixing a brown from yellow ochre plus lemon yellow and a small amount of dioxazene purple and, using a large flat brush with some acrylic medium to make the paint more viscous rather than runny, he applied this to the dark areas of the picture first. Chris mentioned that he always uses flat brushes rather than rounds, even for small details when he uses the edge of a small flat. He used his palette knife to draw in the boats. He next painted in the shore line and then scratched out the tree trunks through the dark mass of trees using his finger nails and brushed in cadmium orange on top of the trees. The tree reflections were painted with a mixture of orange and yellow ochre. Indigo mixed with some medium was used for the water. Purple was added to blue for the darker reflections which were painted with downward strokes with horizontal marks scratched in with a fingernail. Horizontal patches of a darker blue were added to the water for the shadow areas. More trees were scrubbed in using a palette knife and a little acrylic ink was used for finer marks. Purple mixed with yellow gave a good brown for the tree trunks. The boats were painted in cobalt blue and orange and the boat masts were painted in white acrylic using a palette knife. Lemon yellow and green pastels were added for touches of colour. Chris had worked quickly, keeping details to a minimum, and the result was a lively, fresh picture with very little over-working. The yellows and golds gave a sunny autumnal glow to the delightful scene of Warfleet on the River Dart.

Chris was thanked warmly for demonstrating his skills in such a friendly and relaxed manner which had given us all such an enjoyable evening.

# ONLY LOSERS LITTER CAMPAIGN

On 4 February 2020, Mole Valley District Council's (MVDC) Cabinet will consider a report recommending a publicity campaign aimed at discouraging drivers from dropping litter onto road verges.

The 'Only Losers Litter' campaign would warn litterers that they could face a fine of up to £100 if they are caught in the act. In a play on the word 'loser', publicity would feature a driver throwing £10 notes out of their car as they would litter.

Signs would be placed on roads in the district, and the campaign's messages will be publicised on digital channels including MVDC's social media platforms and website. MVDC would also seek coverage in the local media and run an advertising campaign on local radio.

The facility to report littering online at **www.molevalley.gov.uk**/JET will be heavily publicised.

Councillor Claire Malcomson, Cabinet Member for the Environment, said: "Our message is clear: we don't tolerate this anti-social behaviour, and those caught will be fined. Littering on road verges is a blight on Mole Valley's natural environment, and empty cans and bottles can trap small mammals and kill them. We hope that the idea of losing money will deter people from becoming a loser that litters."

# LETTER FROM REVD LIZ

### Dear Friends

Already it seems an age away that I was part of Ockley Dramatic Society playing not one as promised but four tiny parts in the pantomime The Snow Queen. Thank you Martin! And as for the Time Warp dance at the end - well, the less said the better for me as I not always successfully tried to hide at the back! Anyway all great fun and especially as many of you seemed to enjoy it so much. The Society works so hard to provide good drama as well as this wonderful seasonal annual entertainment.

As you read this I imagine Pancake Day will have passed and we will have entered a completely new season - that of Lent. Lent is a time of what the church calls penitence but it is better termed as a time to think about where we are with God, to slow down a bit and appreciate the good things around us, to take time out to think about what is important in life and to regain balance therein. We all have a tendency to be anxious, some more than others and one of the passages in scripture I love is from Matthew's Gospel where Jesus tells us not to worry. He says 'do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?' You will find the whole text in Matthew's gospel Chapter 6 verses 25 to the end of the chapter. It is a wonderful reading and worth pondering on particularly if you are anxious. Lent gives us time then not just to 'give something up' but maybe to consider what is around us, to give thanks for our undoubted blessings, to consider the beauty and intricacy of the Spring flowers and plants and welcome again new life in all it's glory! May I wish you a blessed Lent and a very happy Easter.


### **Walking Group**

### 1. Switch on the defibrillator


 Remove or cut through clothing and wipe away sweat from the chest if necessary
