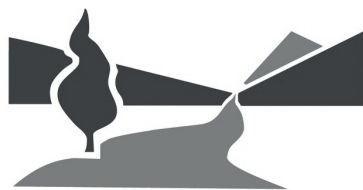

Points of note from the January meeting

The precept for 2022/23 was discussed and it was agreed that it should be £20,000.

Additional expenditure was envisaged on stiles and also on the Neighbourhood Development Plan which is work in progress. Many thanks to SCC Councillor Helyn Clack for the grant funding (£1000) which went towards the replacement of stiles with kissing gates. The kissing gates really have made such a difference on some of the footpaths. Grant funding was also received for the NDP. Plans for the Community Hub (using the school buildings) may also require some funding.

Benches on The Green - some of these need some attention. If you have a responsibility for any of these benches please do check them over and carry out repairs if necessary. Thank you.

Neighbourhood Development Plan - a Character Appraisal of the village has been carried out.

This together with the survey will be discussed at a village meeting which will be held in the spring.

Thursday 10th March

Meet at the Scarlett Arms at 10am for an easy 5.3 mile walk over Lowerhouse Lane to Hurtwood and Plough Lane, returning via North Breache Manor and Pond Head Farm.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

The Platinum Jubilee

A large number of events are planned this year to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and many of these will be associated with the ringing of church bells. At St Margaret's in Ockley we rang



a 'performance' on 6th February, the day of the 70th anniversary of the Queen's accession to the throne, as did hundreds of other towers. There is an organised call to ring out all the bells in the country at the same time over the Jubilee weekend in June to create a national event in celebration of this once in a millennium occasion in a quintessentially English way.

If you would like to take part in this unique experience there is enough time to learn how to ring a bell competently. It is a skill that takes commitment and dedication to acquire but it is well within the capability of most people aged ten or over. It generally takes about 20 hours of tuition, which is freely given on a one to one basis at a mutually convenient time. Look out for our banner outside the church in the weeks up to Easter

Campanology, as bellringing is more formally known, is very rewarding, combining a physical and social activity with the mental exercise of keeping your bell in the right place. Once you are capable of handling a bell independently and able to strike it accurately you can visit almost any set of bells and become a valued member of the band.

English Bell Ringing has its origins in the reign of Henry VIII when churches began to restore bells that had been lost or destroyed during the dissolution of the monasteries. A new mechanism developed in the sixteenth century mounted bells on wheels allowing them to rotate through an entire 360 degrees to produce each sound. This revolutionary change meant that bells weighing several hundredweight could be controlled very precisely with minimal physical effort so that smaller bells could be held up for a fraction of a second to accommodate the slower rate of swing of heavier bells.

This heralded the start of change ringing; the ringing of bells in pre-defined patterns of changes called Methods. Many methods composed then are still rung today.

St Margaret's of Ockley has a fine peal, reputed to be the oldest full set of six working bells in Surrey. The bells are tuned from D to F, with a combined weight of 50cwt, or 2½tonnes; ranging from the smallest bell, 5cwt, known as the treble, to the heaviest, 13cwt, known as the tenor.

The bells were cast, in 1701, at Whitechapel Foundry by Richard Phelps, an acknowledged master craftsman of the time. The Ockley bells were his first

set of bells and he went on to cast many others, including one known as 'Great Tom' still housed in St Paul's Cathedral and the American Liberty Bell was made from the cast of the Ockley tenor. There is a rich and varied history associated with bellringing, and each tower has its own claim to fame.

Practice nights at St. Margaret's, Ockley, are on Wednesdays from 7.45 to 9.15, but if these do not suit there are practices at other towers locally, on different nights

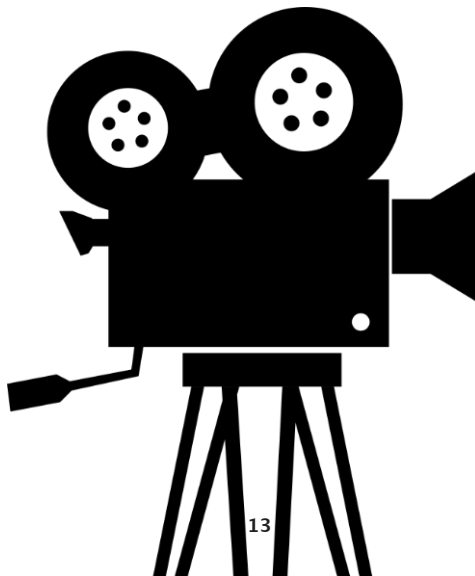
OCKFLIX starts filming

As we write this in an early February blessed by azure skies and sunshine, it seems easy to believe from these early whispers, that Winter's transition into Spring will be well on the way by the time you read this. However, as we know from 2021, Spring can be rather a fickle friend. Temperatures might be rising but don't forget that Jack Frost can continue to hold sway in our gardens as late as May.

But hopefully, by March, the early jewels of the season - crocus, muscari, anemone blanda, iris, chionodoxa, primula and narcissi - will be apparent on your daily commute to the office, or as you walk the dog or pop to the village shop. And we mustn't forget the canary yellow of forsythia and the candy and carmine pinks and reds of daphne, camellia and Japanese quince (chaenomeles) that bring bursts of vibrancy to the garden. As we move through April, an increasing kaleidoscope of colours proclaims that our gardens have well and truly come to life.

Prepare. If you haven't already done so, it's time to turn the soil on veggie beds (removing stubborn weeds) and work in well rotted manure/garden compost. Remember, don't put manure down for root crops (carrots, parsnips), which prefer the addition of sand to encourage deeper growth. Give a good covering of compost to raspberries, and also blueberries (who prefer the ericaceous variety).

'Chit' early and maincrop potatoes to encourage stem growth, in old egg boxes on a windowsill or in a greenhouse, ready to plant out in April. Prepare bean trenches and collect or buy supports for beans and peas ready for May planting.

Propagate flowers from seed for a glorious summer display in late March and April, making sure half-hardy varieties are started off in a heated greenhouse, propagator or on a windowsill. Some you might like to try include Cosmos, Cleome, Antirrhinum (snapdragons) and Zinnia. Alternatively, buy plug plants and grow them on.

Sow tomato, cucumber and pepper seeds indoors, and broad beans, carrots, parsnips, beetroot, onions, lettuces, radish, peas, spinach in pots in a cold greenhouse or cold frame. Label carefully if you have a lot on the go!

Prune Wisteria and grape vines (no later than March); and with sharp secateurs, start or continue to prune shrub and English Roses back by a third, removing all dead wood, and give Hybrid Tea roses a much tougher prune. If you're unsure what rose you have, cut back by no more than a half! Cornus and Salix, with stems grown for winter colour, need cutting back by the end of March. Almost all hydrangeas should be pruned in early Spring (with the exception of climbing hydrangeas). Prune mop head and

lace caps lightly as they produce flowers on older wood. Paniculata and arborescens (including the popular 'Annabelle') can be pruned harder to a lower pair of healthy buds.

Plant lily bulbs and other summer bulbs, such as begonias tubers; bare root roses can still be planted, and it's a great time to add new perennials to your borders. Early March is a good time to divide perennials (not yet in active growth): choose a day when the soil is dry and dig up the plant with a fork; split into smaller parts using a knife or spade; make sure the 'new' plants are replanted in a border or pot and watered straight away. Plant sharing with neighbours and friends is a really cost-effective way to expand the plants in your garden (just ensure they don't come with any invasive weeds such as ground elder!)

Early potatoes should be planted out in late March, second earlies in the first half of April then main crop in the second half. It's also the right time to plant onions, shallots and garlic.

Plants of the Season

Willow trees, such as *Salix caprea* Kilmarnock, whose drooping branches are festooned with soft yellow catkins, provide interest in gardens of all sizes. Later on, *Clematis Alpina*, with its delicate bell shaped flowers, is an asset to any garden, as are the beautiful heart-shaped flowers of *Lamprocampanos* (previously *Dicentra!*) *spectabilis*.



And Finally, bear in mind that the Ockley, Okewood and Forest Green Summer Fair will definitely be happening on Saturday August 13th this year and the organising committee say it will be the best show ever. So plan your planting to produce prize winning vegetables and beautiful flowers to fill the show marquee.

BATTLE OF OCKLEY

I, no doubt like many others, was interested to read the article summarised from Mr Chouler's book, *Tales of Old Surrey, Myths, Legends and Folklore*. Briony Thomas wrote a rather more factual account in the *Parish Magazine* in 2011.

As well as the human remains found on Etherley Farm, 2 burials were exhumed in Bury Wood, shown on the 1860 Ordnance Survey map, which is at the top of the hill on the A29 north of Ockley.

The field where the bonfire has been held recently behind Weavers Pond, the pond by the Ockley Green, was called Battle Field while when Weavers Pond was dredged in the 1940's or 50's an armoured breast plate was found which is labelled as from the Battle of Ockley but is actually Cromwellian so from another battle!

Chouler suggests that the Weald (of Surrey, Sussex and Kent) was a continuous Oak Forest. Dr Oliver Rackham of Cambridge University suggests in his 1986 book, *The History of the Countryside*, that maybe 70% of the area was woodland with many more species according to the pollen record and with many hamlets in clearings dotted through the woodland.

The village of Ockley was located by the Church (St Margaret's) and the Manor House (Ockley Court). St Margaret's dates from about 1200 so it is possible that there was an earlier building and a hamlet there in 851! Ockley didn't migrate to the present site round the Green and along the A29 until after 1600. Apparently, it was safer to live away from the road because it was used by highway men or in the case of the Battle of Ockley, the Vikings.

The location of the Battle is highly speculative. Three lines in the Anglo-Saxon chronicle written some 100 years later in Northumberland refer to it taking place at ACLEA. Domesday book, written about 1086 so some 230 years later records Hoclei. Though there is another place referenced in Domesday book, Arseste which has been suggested was modern Hartshurst just beneath Leith Hill and to the East of Etherley Farm.

Chouler refers to Anstiebury Hill Fort as where the Vikings camped. That is west of Stane Street, the supposed route they were taking. The route of Stane Street north of Ockley going to Dorking is now no longer used, was it still in use in 851? A short section of the old street was uncovered in Redland Wood on the slope of Leith Hill so it is possible that the Vikings kept to the higher, drier ground and came to Anstiebury. Some historians suggest that the road from Dorking to Coldharbour was the replacement route of Stane Street, passing very close to Anstiebury.

Ockley Manor includes Holmbury Hill Fort, on the hill above Ewhurst, as an outlying part of the Manor. The presumption is that most Manors in this part of Surrey included land on the sand hills as well as Wealden clay, so the inhabitants had access to different soil types. Excavations suggest that both hill forts, which date from the iron age, so some 2000 years before the battle, were really places to congregate with animals at time of danger. Holmbury would have been a likely place for the Saxons to assemble, with views over Stane street and the Weald and it is South of Etherley if that was the site of the battle.

Chouler in his book suggests the final remnants of the Viking army were killed in Leigh, Mertsam and by the women of Charlwood. There was also a legend that the women of Capel finished off the remnants and have had a reputation of ferocity ever since.

THE AMBER FOUNDATION

At Amber we aim to support vulnerable and disadvantaged young people to transform their own lives by helping them move out of homelessness and unemployment into bright secure futures. We see the potential in everyone. Based at three residential centres – one right here in Ockley, in Devon and Wiltshire and soon to open our fourth in Kent, we offer a supported housing environment that's a little bit different. Not just education, training and support to address specific personal issues but also new experiences and opportunities that raise their aspiration and challenge the residents to take responsibility for their lives and move forward positively.

Based around our model of 'dreams and desires' we provide each individual with a bespoke, practical programme of activities that builds their skills, qualifications, develops their resilience and purpose, improves their confidence and wellbeing and focuses firmly on their strengths and interests. Ultimately our aim is to help as many young people as possible move on to sustainable work, a secure home and a fulfilling future.

One of our young people has written the following:

The Amber Foundation can be a lot of different things to a lot of different people. Be this a sanctuary, respite or rehabilitation centre. For me personally, Amber served as a second chance. You see, from an early age I suffered from depression and social anxiety. This caused a losing battle to commence within my head. A battle whose spoils were nothing short of my very soul. So, when I first arrived at Amber Farm Place I had already been defeated and saw no hope for my future.

However, with the hard work and diligence of the amazing staff members at Amber I began to slowly piece together the broken shards of my life. The first steps were to ascertain exactly where my problem lay in the first place, in short, what was keeping me in the past and unable to move forward. My Team Leader supported me in facing my demons head on, by scheduling counselling sessions and a prescription of medication. It is important to note that none of this was forced upon me. At no point did I feel pressured into seeking professional help, it was explained and discussed giving me the final say.

Now came the hardest part of my journey. Analysing myself and where I wanted to be. Again, the patience and understanding staff members at Amber came to my rescue. Amber arranged for me to meet with a mentor once a week where my future was discussed in full. Eventually I came to the decision that I wanted to be a social worker. I wished to draw on my own personal trauma to aid others on similar journeys to my own. I brought this idea forward to my Team Leader and for the first time in 25 years I was not met with "Are you sure?" or "I don't think that's a good idea" I was instead

met with overwhelming support and a customised programme schedule that would help me achieve my goals. First things first – I needed to revisit my education. My Team Leader and I sought courses that would give me what I failed to achieve in school, and I began my GCSE maths and English, achieving grades that I had previously never thought possible. More importantly however, they were grades that allowed me to progress to the next step.

The next step was to identify an appropriate Access to Higher Education course. Various support staff at Amber were true to their title and aided me with workshops based around interview skills and coping mechanisms for when I was unable to lean on them for support. Now I am approaching the end of my journey with university looming in the near distance and my whole life ahead of me. A life I would have never dreamed of living without Amber, nor the determination and support of the incredibly caring, thoughtful people who work there. My name is Michael Owen, and The Amber Foundation transformed my life.

1. Switch on the defibrillator

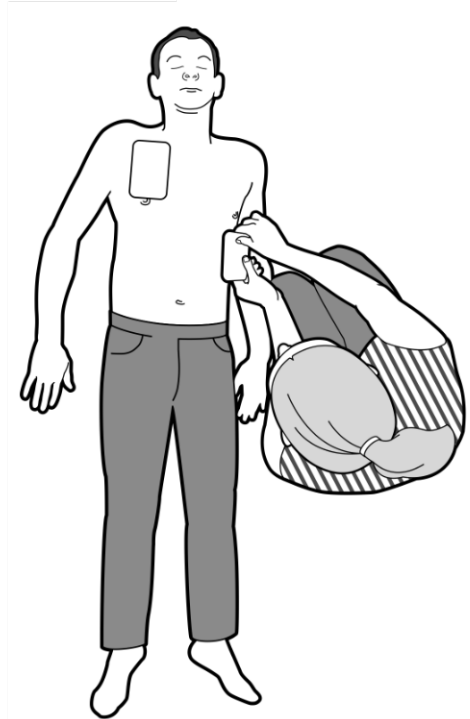
- Remove or cut through clothing and wipe away sweat from the chest if necessary
