

# DAVID WAUGH (1943-2023) Eulogy by his son Nathan

Dad. Dave. Woofy. Uncle Dave. Gruncle Dave (that's short for Great Uncle by the way). Gramps, Papi. Known by many names my Dad was many things to many people. But all those who knew and loved him will have experienced the same with him.

The same rock-solid core of total reliability. The same unwavering loyalty. That same youthful, often rebellious spirit of fun and adventure. And, of course, that same 'can do' attitude and energy which carried him and those with him throughout his life. Never was a task too much for him. Confronted with a problem he'd sit quietly, often in his workshop, figure out how it needed to be done and then go and do it. There have been many times when faced with a problem or challenge that I've thought to myself 'what would Dad do' and it's always helped me find the solution.

The sadness in the days after he passed was alleviated greatly by the many many fond memories, stories and testimonies from those who knew and loved him - friends through the decades in the many communities that he was an integral part of.

One of those earliest and longest-standing communities was the group of sport parachutists my dad and mum were both part of in the sixties and seventies - which he remained close friends with through the rest of his life.

That was in the very earliest days of sport parachuting and, together with this group of pioneers, my Dad was instrumental in forming the Duck End Farm parachuting club, using his considerable artistic talents to design the club logo amongst many other things. With this club they formed a close band of...more than friends really, friends who became family...and travelled the world for competitions.

One testimony in particular from an old parachuting colleague of Dad's stood out and I'd like to share it, as I think it sums him up perfectly. "In a time when the skydiving attitude of UK officialdom was distinctly military, I remember Dave being completely the opposite. He stood way out from everyone else in his thoughtfulness, consideration, kindness and focused, intelligent attitude. It was impossible not to like him".

Dad continued with the sport until it became clear that parachuting, particularly considering the somewhat basic equipment available in the sport in those early days, wasn't necessarily conducive to starting a family! So Dad gradually moved away from the sport and he and Mum settled in Ockley.

When they first moved to Ockley, within a few years Dad had spotted a problem with the path which led down to the Doctors Surgery on the green. A narrow pavement beside a busy and fast main road. In 1984, with a group of local residents, he organised a community initiative to fund and

build a safe and secure path so the elderly and mums with babies could walk safely down the village to the doctors.

Both the path and the society which the initiative led to, the Ockley Society, remain to this day.

The Ockley Society was a key part of Dad's life - working with close friends to deliver, year after year, fantastic and engaging community events which brought everyone together and was instrumental in making Ockley such a wonderful community to live and grow up in.

The community initiatives Dad was involved with - such as Cricket Sevens, Ocklympics, the Bonfire and many others - have really stood the test of time.

Many of us will recall the sight of the OckSoc marquee going up on the green or for the village bonfire and Dad would inevitably be right there in the middle of this mass of canvas, heaving away on the heavy central poles with the rest of the team to get it upright.

The OckSoc marquee was another great example of Dad's unmatched talent for making the most out of things for which others had no further use. It had been utilised for a work function he was responsible for and when it became clear that it was simply going to be discarded, Dad liberated it and it went on to become a mainstay of OckSoc events for decades…and even remains so now.

The same was true of his woodworking. Where others might see an old warped and discarded piece of wood he'd be able to envisage and then create a beautifully made and lovingly polished oak shelf. Much of the built in furniture in our family home was made this way by Dad and almost all of it from discarded pieces of wood and offcuts.

Dad's involvement in the community extended also to the Dramatic Society where in early and later years Dad was involved in set building, of course creating his iconic and instantly recognisable banners, and a few memorable turns on stage in pantomimes!

Friends and, in particular, close and meaningful friendships were incredibly important to Dad. Yet large crowds and multiple people were never really his thing, preferring instead at parties or gatherings to have thoughtful conversations with a handful of people.

Fortunately, he had in Mum, his wife of 46 years, someone who was more than willing to take on his share of chatter as well as her own! Complementing each other's strengths in this and so many other ways was what made that marriage such a strong and lasting one. It was Mum's love for Dad, her strength, dedication and support in the last years of his life which helped him so much and ensured that despite his strength failing he remained comfortable right until the end.

Another of his enduring loves throughout his life was Leith Hill - where

Dad could often be found running in rain or shine. He never ever tired of the scenery and got to know the area and all the trails like the back of his hand. It's where he wants his ashes to be scattered and I can think of no more fitting place.

I remember when running with music became a thing. Walkmans were pretty new and some of the other runners around the village had started listening to music whilst running and were encouraging dad to try it too. So he reluctantly gave it a go - putting on the theme to *Last of the Mohicans* on a Walkman as he set off on another fast-paced romp up the hill. Well that experiment lasted about ten minutes when he realised he much preferred the sounds of nature, birdsong and the wind rustling through the trees – and that was the first and last time he ran with headphones.

Strength fitness and activity were incredibly important to Dad. Which is why being robbed of his energy in later years seemed particularly cruel. But he never once complained, preferring as always to focus on the positives. Recalling with pleasure the achievements he had made like the 35 marathons and half-marathons he completed.

A superbly talented artist, Dad was always generous and thoughtful with his sketches and paintings. When he painted someone familiar, or even when he had created something he thought someone would like, he'd go off, get it framed and then present it to the person. No fanfare, nothing ever wanted in return – Dad just genuinely loved making people happy by sharing his gift with them. As a result, I'm sure many people here today are happy to have a 'David Waugh Original' on their wall at home.

So many fond memories of time growing up with Dad and what I learned from him. One in particular always makes me smile. And it's really indicative of Dad's character, his practical attitude and his ability to find solutions and always see the positives in everything. I was doing my GCSEs and was behind in my design technology practical coursework. And when I say behind...of course I hadn't started it. As luck would have it I happened to get myself a day or two suspension from school for some minor transgression. Expecting a telling off from Dad – and I did get that – but also he immediately saw that this gave him and I the opportunity to work together to get the project done. He took a couple of days off work and we spent hours together in his workshop doing the project from start to finish.

He really lived for his children, me and Emily, and nothing was ever too much for him. He was a truly devoted and loving dad. Fiercely protective and always supportive. Looking back now it's clear to see how much that dedication brought to us both and how well it set us up for our own lives. Latterly that same devotion and love was given to his grandchildren – Echo, Flash, Harry and Gabriel. Sadly his gradually decreasing health meant he just didn't have the energy to play with them as actively he'd have liked to

have done, and how he certainly would have done before. But he absolutely loved having them around and drew such joy and pleasure from them.

Quite recently, mum told me how he was looking for something in his wallet and he turned out an old photo he had tucked in there, years before, of Emily and me. He said to mum "I was a good dad, wasn't I?" Yes Dad, you were. You were the best.

I wish I'd told you this more while you were alive – but I love you. I'll always miss you. I learnt so much from you and I am so proud to be your son. Sleep well Pa.

We will remember David Waugh. He was at the centre of village life for many years, always with characteristic energy and imagination in everything he did.

I shall remember him for a lot of things, but probably most of all for his journalistic flair. Following the 2004 Indian Ocean earthquake and tsunami I discussed with him how my own organisation should respond to it. I was trying to write something to appeal to the management to influence that response. He gave me two pieces of advice about how to get attention.

First, he said, your words must pass the bus stop test. By this he meant using the kind of language that you would use when speaking to a stranger in a queue for the bus: simple, uncomplicated words uttered with passion work best. Nobody wants a lecture in a bus queue.

The second was even simpler. Think of the Sun headline: just three words. This principle, he said could be applied to any situation and anyone can use it, not just the Sun.

Whenever I write, I shall think of David.

# OAKWOOD HILL VILLAGE HALL

Owned by the Diocese of Guildford, Oakwood Hill Village Hall was quite literally re-built from the ground up around a decade ago. It was an amazing feat by a dedicated committee and volunteer supporters led by Barry Thomson and with many others taking very active roles. They have put in much time and effort over the years,



despite lockdown and the sad deaths of two other key committee members. The time has come for them to stand down and there are now the beginnings of a new committee ready to carry on the good work.

Jane Hurst, Yvonne Staines and Nigel Bingham responded to the call for new volunteers and they are now looking for more people to join them. This does not necessarily mean joining the committee but there are other ways to help that don't need you to come to meetings

The hall is currently in need of cladding repairs and the team are starting fund raising for this and applying for grants to help meet the cost. A village hall website is under construction and will hopefully be live by the time you read this at <a href="www.oakwoodhillvillagehall.org">www.oakwoodhillvillagehall.org</a> The website will include the ability to take bookings online.

Currently, the hall is used for some regular weekly events such as Pilates on Tuesday mornings and band practice on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. There are also annual events such as the Summer Fair and Flower show on the second Saturday in August and a Macmillan Coffee morning in September. The team are working on ways that this valuable and vital village asset can be used more widely. It's a brilliant facility, in a lovely location, with a well-equipped kitchen and wonderful inside and outside space. The committee believe that the village hall has the potential to play a greater role at the heart of our community and beyond, bringing people together to learn, create, exercise, and get out and meet neighbours and make new friends.

# THE EARLY SPRING GARDEN

We've certainly been on a temperature rollercoaster this winter, with a range from about -8 to a few degrees above at night-time. And on many days in a row, it was 0 degrees all day. Your plants and gardens, perhaps like ours, may be recovering slowly yet with several fallen comrades who succumbed to the onslaught a very determined lack Frost. Defoliated and denuded pittosporum balls; brown-leaved ceanothus; fuchsia and penstemon that look decidedly more sorry for themselves than normal. So, whilst the azure skies and recent sunshine, together with a host of bulbs peeping expectantly through frozen soil, lead us to believe that winter's grip is in decline, we know from past experience that spring can be a fickle friend for a few months yet. But there are hints to enjoy. Bright purple crocus, lemon-yellow winter aconites and alabaster snowdrops are already bejewelling our green spaces, alongside the sweet-smelling delicate Daphne. In late Feb and March, there are further treasures to discover including muscari, anemone blanda, iris, chionodoxa, primula, narcissi and hyacinths. And we mustn't forget the canary-yellow of forsythia and the candy and carmine pinks and reds of camellia and Japanese quince (chaenomeles) that bring vibrancy to the garden. As we move through April, the kaleidoscope of colours well and truly heralds that spring is very much upon us.

**Prepare.** If you haven't already done so, it's time to turn the soil on veggie beds - removing stubborn weeds - and work in well rotted manure/garden compost. Remember, don't put manure down for root crops (carrots, parsnips), which prefer the addition of sand to encourage deeper growth. Give a good covering of compost to raspberries, and also blueberries (who prefer the ericaceous variety). 'Chit' early and maincrop potatoes to encourage stem growth, in old egg boxes on a windowsill or in a greenhouse, ready to plant out in April. Prepare bean trenches and collect or buy supports for beans and peas ready for May planting.

**Propagate** flowers from seed for a glorious summer display in late March and April, making sure half-hardy varieties are started off in a heated greenhouse, propagator or on a windowsill. Some of you might like to try include Cosmos, Cleome, Antirrhinum (snapdragons) and Zinnia. Alternatively, buy plug plants and grow them on. Sow tomato, cucumber and pepper seeds indoors, and broad beans, carrots, parsnips, beetroot, onions, lettuces, radish, peas, spinach in pots in a cold greenhouse or cold frame. Label carefully if you have a lot on the go!

**Prune** Wisteria and grape vines (no later than March); and with sharp secateurs, start or continue to prune shrub and English Roses back by a third, removing all dead wood, and give Hybrid Tea roses a much tougher prune. If you're unsure what rose you have, cut back by no more than a

half! Cornus and Salix, with stems grown for winter colour, need cutting back by the end of March. Almost all hydrangeas should be pruned in early Spring (with the exception of climbing hydrangeas). Prune mop head and lace caps lightly as they produce flowers on older wood. Paniculata and arborescens (including the popular 'Annabelle') can be pruned harder to a lower pair of healthy buds.

**Plant** lily bulbs and other summer bulbs, such as begonias tubers; bare root roses can still be planted, and it's a great time to add new perennials to your borders. Early March is a good time to divide perennials (not yet in active growth): choose a day when the soil is dry and dig up the plant with a fork; split into smaller parts using a knife or spade; make sure the 'new' plants are replanted in a border or pot and watered straight away. Plant sharing with neighbours and friends is a really cost-effective way to expand the plants in your garden (just ensure they don't come with any invasive weeds such as ground elder!) Early potatoes should be planted out in late March, second earlies in the first half of April then main crop in the second half. It's also the right time to plant onions, shallots and garlic.

#### Plants of the Season

Willow trees, such as Salix caprea Kilmarnock, whose drooping branches are festooned with soft yellow catkins, provide interest in gardens of all sizes. Later on, Clematis Alpina, with its delicate bell-shaped flowers, is an asset to any garden, as are the beautiful heart-shaped flowers of Lamprocampnos



(previously Dicentra!) spectabilis.

And finally, make sure that the Okewood, Ockley & Forest Green Summer Fair and Flower Show is firmly in your diaries! It's on Saturday August 12<sup>th</sup>. Why not start planning what to plant to produce prize winning vegetables and beautiful flowers to fill the show marquee. # Learn to Ring - for the King

A year on from our plans to ring for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee here we are again with a number



of events being organised to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III on 6th May. Many of these events will include the ringing of church bells. At St Margaret's in Ockley we expect to do our bit, just as last year.

Following the pandemic however bellringing is experiencing a marked shortage of ringers in that a number of them have not returned after the lockdowns, for various reasons, coupled with being prevented from recruiting normally for nearly 3 years.

Across the country we are actively seeking to train new bell-ringers who will be able to Ring for the King when he is crowned on May 6th and after that. There has been a lot of interest generated in the press and on television resulting in a huge number of enquiries nationally.

Bell ringing is a wonderful hobby for people of all ages and there is something of interest to everybody, including:

- Teamwork working as a team to ring changes together
- Physical and mental exercise ringing is a technique that doesn't involve brute strength but coordination and technique to control the bell in split-second timing
- Music creating the changes and permutations bell-ringers call music
- Social bell-ringers are very sociable people and can often be found in a pub or coffee shop after ringing sessions.
- Friendship bell-ringers have friends all over the UK and the world where bells are rung English style

Contact Sue, Ockley tower captain, and come along to watch and get an idea of what is involved. Learning to ring church bells is a structured process that takes a number of one-to-one sessions to be competent at 'handling' a bell. You don't have to be a churchgoer, there is no compulsion to stay for services. While almost anyone is capable of leaning to ring, it is not easy and requires a lot of dedication to master. Are you up to the challenge? You too could be taking part in this unique occasion in a quintessentially English way.

# Report for 2022

In 2022 our Speedwatchers participated in 178 hour-long sessions at the roadside to monitor traffic on the A29 in Ockley.

During these sessions 63,234 vehicles passed by, most of them respecting the 30-mph speed limit.

Nevertheless, our Speedwatchers recorded an average of fourteen offenders per hour, or in other words 4% of the traffic was exceeding the speed limit.

Yet, the A29 in Ockley remains dangerous. With no pedestrian crossings, no streetlights to illuminate the road, pedestrians and drivers are at risk and we must continue our efforts to make Ockley a safer place.



#### FIELD ARCHERY Vs. TARGET ARCHERY

We at Team Sagittarius enjoy the sport of archery and promote this relaxing and fun pastime suitable for the whole family.

**Target Archery.** Is the form that most folks recognise, with it being in the Olympics, shooting recurve bows with stabilisers, sights carbon or aluminium, arrows with plastic vanes for flights etc. There are many target clubs around. Usually you will find target archers shooting rounds of arrows up to 70 yards at standard bullseye style paper faces with colours of yellow, red, blue, black and white in a pleasant setting of cut grass pasture. On pleasant days the twang of bow strings and the zing of arrows are almost as common place as the sound of leather on willow. Fun for all the family who enjoy a very civilised day out.

**Field Archery.** This style of archery is more for the traditional of mind, set in rustic woodlands up and down the country the call of the wild can be strong when one is experiencing the thump of a heavy wooden arrow hitting its mark. 
