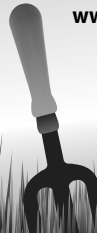

# NEWS FROM THE BELFRY



## Virtual Bellringing

The article for this edition of the magazine was going to be about all the celebratory ringing planned, particularly in May. There was a county wide call to

ring on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> for Surrey Day; a large number of events planned for the following week in celebration of the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE Day, as well as for a wedding at Ockley. Our newest recruits were due to be married the following week and that too has sadly had to be postponed.

Like everyone else, the coronavirus has impacted significantly – we have not been able to ring since 23<sup>rd</sup> March and at the time of writing we still do not know when ringing will recommence. Suffice to say there will be much celebrating when we are able to once again. Apparently August 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> are possibilities for a joint VE and VJ Day celebration.

We have, however, managed to hold virtual practices using Zoom, the benefit of which many people are enjoying during isolation. A meeting is arranged, invitees join by following the link sent to them by the convener at the prearranged time. Each participant can see and hear everyone else on their screen at home. At 7pm on Wednesdays we sign in, there were nine of us the first week, each with our own bell at home, one glass, even a waste bin, to make a noise. The aim was to attempt rounds and call changes but it is difficult to get the spacing right, so mainly we just have a good time catching up on each other's news and offering support. There is also a Listening CD of deliberate striking errors to detect and so we have a short session with that too.

Listening skills are needed to identify which bell in a row is not correct and at which stroke, as some errors are at hand or back stroke and not always both, so that when ringing for real you will be able to correct yourself if you are the one at fault. Briefly a row of rounds should sound:

1-2-3-4-5-6-1-2-3-4-5-6—1-2-3-4-5-6-1-2-3-4-5-6—

There is an even space between each bell, first at handstroke and then the 1 (treble) follows the 6 (tenor) with the same gap for the following backstroke. There is a wider space when the treble leads again, at handstroke, following the tenor's backstroke, known as the handstroke gap.

If the rounds sounded:

1-2-34--5-6-1-2-3-4-5-6—Then the 4 is too close, or quick, at hand, but the backstroke is correct

1-2-3--45-6-1-2-3-4-5-6—Then the 4 is late, or slow at hand but the backstroke is correct

1-2-3-4-5-6-1-2-34--5-6—Then the 4 is quick, or too close at backstroke but the preceding handstroke was correct.

Obviously there are any number of variations and the benefit of using a CD is that the errors are artificial and can be repeated. When ringing, the errors are often irregular, particularly with newer ringers and only a persistent problem would be commented on, if not corrected by the ringer them self. The exercises also progress to more than one bell striking falsely and at different strokes in the same piece, making it more difficult to work out the solution.

There are other activities related to ringing available, many online, and they are particularly useful at the moment to help ringers to maintain and continue to develop their skills, from reading material, podcasts, quizzes, worksheets and apps such as method ringing with Abel as well as a wealth of videos on YouTube and new apps being created as the lockdown continues.

Bellringing is an art which has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years. It is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, friendship, a challenge of wits and skill which gives great satisfaction when it goes right. If you would like to find out more, please come along. When we resume, practice nights are at St. Margaret's in Ockley, on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month from 7.45 to 9.15, and at St John's in Capel on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> weeks.

# THE GARDEN IN MAY

Well, it's all happening! And have we ever had greater cause to be thankful for our gardens and the area we live in?

After the 'warm-up Acts' of March and April, which provided much-needed optimism and continuity in troubled times, the garden has burst into uncompromising, hyper-charged growth full of the old familiar sights and scents. Clematis, Cardoons, Lily of the Valley, Wild Garlic, Wisteria, Allium, Spiraea Arguta (the white frothy one) and Rhododendrons are all doing their familiar bit to remind us the World goes on.

Of course, the Coronavirus restrictions are creating an almighty hiatus to our habits: at the time of writing it looks like those trips to the garden centre to fill your boot with bedding will not be happening this year. But what a time for a positive 'Reset'! It's surely a great opportunity time to get back to basics and re-visit the good gardening practices of gardeners gone by. Bring back Geoff Hamilton (or even Percy Thrower!) and dust off that fabulous 'David Brookes Garden Design' masterwork.

So, here are some things to be getting on with....

All your perennial plants such as Lupin, Delphinium, Hollyhocks, Lavender, Peony should be in full flower this month and towards the end of May it will be safe to plant out summer bedding plants in pots and hanging baskets as well as in beds. It is worth lifting and dividing daffodils and other spring bulbs and of course as soon as we are safe from frost it will be time to plant your over wintered Dahlia tubers.

In the vegetable garden potatoes planted last month will need earthing up, and Brassicas will need protecting from Cabbage White butterfly (use old net curtains or fleece for this). It's worth successional sowing Carrots, Lettuce and spring onions in order to have a continuous supply through the summer. French Beans and Runner Beans can be sown straight into the ground or planted out if brought on in the greenhouse, and Courgettes can be planted out. In June Tomatoes, Cucumbers and Peppers can be planted up and put in a warm sunny spot or in growbags and pots in a greenhouse.

Lawns should be regularly cut each week now and of course regular hoeing will keep down the weeds in your flower beds. At the time of writing the Coronavirus lock down is still in force with no end in sight, summer events are being cancelled and even the Okewood, Ockley and Forest Green Summer Fair is in doubt (watch this space). So enjoy your garden and the quiet roads and skies and above all keep safe.

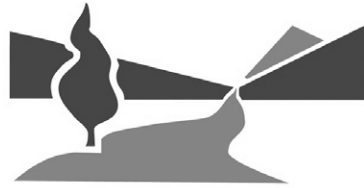

# 110 YEARS AGO

On 6<sup>th</sup> May 1910, King Edward VII, successor to Queen Victoria, died at the age of 68. He had only reigned for 9 years but before that had been Prince of Wales for 59 years – longer than anyone else in history. He was a popular figure and the following extracts from the parish magazine show how the news was received at the time.

*Ockley Parish Magazine June issue 1910*

## King Edward

"On May the fifth we read in our morning papers that the King was ill, but as he had been doing work on the day before, we hoped it was not serious. In the evening we heard that his illness was very critical, and the next morning we heard the sad tidings that he was dead.

It was so sudden, so unexpected, that it gave a shock to everyone in the country.

England may have had before sovereigns as wise and as good, but never one more popular. His popularity was not only confined to this country. Wherever he went (and he visited many countries) he was liked and loved.

So much has been written and said on this subject that it is unnecessary to write much. Briefly we all feel that we have lost a wise and capable monarch – one who had a high sense of what was his duty to the country, and who carried it out with zeal and very great ability.

Nothing like his funeral has been seen in this, or indeed in any other country. Almost the whole world joined in showing respect for him. Many kings have gained what it called glory from the making of wars. He gained higher honour still as the maker and maintainer of peace.

A good head – a kind heart – a sympathetic nature – and a very thorough knowledge of mankind – these were the chief points in a character which will always be held in high honour in the history of our country. We in this village, as loyal subjects, desire to add our tribute of praise and gratitude to his memory".

## Memorial Service

"There was a Memorial Service at St Margaret's on the day of the King's funeral, between one and two o'clock. It consisted of the Litany, the Burial Service, Special Prayers authorised for the occasion and the following hymns, "Nearer my God to Thee", "O God our help in ages past" and "On the Resurrection morning". At the conclusion of the service Mr Moore played the "Dead March from Saul". The Church was full to overflowing with parishioners, who came to

pay the last mark of respect to King Edward, and to pray for his family, and especially his son King George.”

## Empire Day

“Owing to the recent death of King Edward, the County Council did not wish the school children to march round the parish according to their usual custom, but the Rector gave them an address on “The Empire” in school, and patriotic songs were sung, concluding with three cheers for the King”.

I feel humbled by the heroism and sacrifices made by our frontline key workers in the NHS, our care homes, our supermarkets, our farmers, our local shopworkers open all hours, our postal workers, our transport drivers, our delivery drivers and of course the army of volunteers made up of those who are not as vulnerable health wise as others. The list is endless. Our communities are so good at stepping into the breach aren't they with local helplines and of course the neighbourliness of our villages comes into its own...

Someone said to me from the other side of the road a week or so ago that he guessed I didn't have any work to do now it was lockdown. How wrong they were! There has of course been a dramatic change in how we as church operate in the communities in which we serve. From initial changes in hand hygiene around Holy Communion, to the communicants not receiving wine, but the wafer which is sufficient anyway, to the postponement of regular worship, to the churches being closed completely. This is almost unheard of as our churches stand and are always a place of sanctuary all through the ages and wars this country

has known. Always open for private prayer and reflection even if Sunday worship is not your thing. This has been very sad and difficult for us all and it has meant that a lot of clergy and others have had to turn to modern technology; in my case kicking and screaming, to record worship from home, to meet with others on Zoom, to learn new ways of doing things generally which I can tell you is very exhausting indeed! Every day it seemed at the beginning things would change. You'd just managed to master one new thing and suddenly it all had to be rethought! There is also a case for returning to the old ways isn't there though and use the telephone and write letters and I would say visiting people but that's not so easy in these social distancing days; although I think there are some good conversations over the garden fence and out of windows! Our first priority at church has to be prayer. The Daily Office of the Church of England, you can see it online on the Church of England website, and I try to pray this twice a day at home; see [www.churchofengland.org](http://www.churchofengland.org) if you wish to join in or I can give you a paper copy of the service. It is a very reassuring constant to get into the habit of praying this during these worrying times. Added to that we are keeping in touch with everyone by the weekly church news sheet with readings for that week along with some commentary and local news updates and of course prayer requests. Last week for Easter we then took the plunge and thanks to Dik Hoogmoed our website designer and Bob Cranham our house guitarist, Cafe Church leader, and Cottage Concert impresario (!) we managed to put together an Easter service. We are now hoping that online worship will be available each week. Go to [www.capelandockleychurch.org.uk](http://www.capelandockleychurch.org.uk) and follow links to online services. Well that's all very well I can hear you say, for those with computers and smart phones etc but what about those who can't access these technological gadgets. So, I can deliver through your door a copy of our weekly news sheet and a copy of the online talk. Do let me know if you'd like to be included on my delivery list! Ring me on 01306 711260.

For those who have sadly lost loved ones during these times it is very difficult as social distancing has meant many in care homes or hospitals have not been able to have their nearest and dearest at their side. Funerals can continue, maximum of 10 mourners, at crematoria and similar for a burial which can only be conducted at the graveside. Although this may seem very strange, actually these simple services can still be very meaningful and special. Weddings and Christenings have had to be postponed till churches are open once more and that's also very disappointing for many families. However we know that the current restrictions are for our own safety and protection and we can look forward to the time when we can all be together in one place, once more. So much has changed, been postponed or cancelled but one thing wasn't cancelled this year and that was Easter. We can't nor do we wish to put it on hold or even ask for a refund?! Easter comes anyway. Just like

Jesus. We may be stuck at home in fear of catching the Coronavirus; a bit like the disciples shut away for fear of the authorities but this doesn't stop the risen Jesus from coming among us, just as he did in those first resurrection appearances as told in the Book of Acts in the New Testament section of the Bible. It's a good read if you want to know what 'happened next' following the resurrection. Jesus' suffering and fear are not the end of his story and they are not the end of ours either. So I pray that you will in your own way also know the love and power of the risen Lord, the comfort and peace that he alone can bring during these days. Don't forget I and others are here for any to speak to, by email, text, letter, or good old fashioned telephone, anytime, any day. I look forward to writing in a few more weeks when hopefully restrictions are lifted and times may well be different but hopefully all things will work eventually for good as God promises.
