UPDATE ON THE QUICK RESPONSE MEMORIAL WOODLAND

On 2nd April we had a very successful Easter Egg Hunt at the woodland which was enjoyed by many local children and families. It was great fun and the rain stopped. We even had a few rays of sunshine to add to what was a very enjoyable day. We raised some much-appreciated funds which has gone into the Memorial Fund to assist Veterans who are in difficulty. All monies raised by QRMW at our events are used for the upkeep of the Memorial Woodland and to assist those Veterans who are going through a difficult time. All of us who work for the Charity are volunteers.

The woodland is looking beautiful now that Spring is fully with us. The longer days are encouraging the plants, shrubs and trees to come alive and the birds are incredibly busy making their nest some are already feeding young. Spring is such a lovely time of the year and full of promise.

I must tell you about our next important event at the Memorial Woodland which will take place on June 10th; it will be our 9th Anniversary since the woodland was officially opened and a Commemoration Service will take place at the woodland. Four families who have lost family members who were veterans will be honouring their loved ones and planting saplings. This is a very special event, a day of remembrance plus celebration, at which we will have the Redhill Band and Corp of Drums, Veteran singer Rodney Dell, BBQ, Bar and a number of stalls - including some lovely crafts, merchandise, bottle tombola and grand raffle. EVERYONE is welcome so do put it in your diaries to come and join us at 12.30 on Saturday 10th June. Belmont School are allowing visitors to park in their car parks and we will be running a shuttle service for everyone to and from the woodland, which means our car park is free for the vintage military vehicles which will be on display. We are thrilled to have been informed by the CEO that his young Cadets from Frimley & Camberley Cadet Corps will be joining us as usual. These young people are the only cadets who are allowed to wear The Queen's Regiment Cap Badge in the UK.

Visitors to the woodland are always welcome. Bring a picnic and sit at one of our picnic benches and enjoy the peace and tranquility of our lovely woodland in the heart of the Surrey Hills. We are open 24/7. If we are not present on the day that you come, you can park at the front of the main car park and walk in the side gate. If we are there, then the Visitors Centre will be open and you can enjoy the collection of military memorabilia that the families of those Veterans who are honoured at the woodland have donated to us for all to enjoy.

OCKLEY'S AMERICAN CONNECTION

In 1638 the then Rector of Ockley, Henry Whitfield, resigned his living and in 1639 led a party to America. The reason for his resignation was religious persecution. The Puritans considered that the Church of England created by Henry VIII had 'cut off the head, but left the body of the Catholic Church (the services) unchanged'. Archbishop Laud created a Commission and Whitfield was censored.

The Civil War which started in 1642 was in part a religious war.

Whitfield was probably born in Greenwich, Kent in about 1592. He was educated at New College, Oxford. Initially a lawyer, he was ordained in 1618 and became Rector of Ockley. He had married Dorothy Shaefe. In 1633 he met two other clergymen, John Cotton and Thomas Hooker, to try to persuade them to remain in the Church, but failed and they both emigrated to America. He followed them 6 years later. Whitfield was a friend of George Fenwick at Oxford who founded the Saybrook Colony, Connecticut.

After leaving Ockley, Whitfield sold property he had inherited from his father and gathered a group of non-conformists (Puritans) to emigrate to America. They left England in two ships and in June 1639 a month before they arrived in New Haven (then called Quinnipiac) 25 of them signed a covenant 'we will, the Lord assisting us, sit down and join ourselves together in one entire plantation and to be helpful each to other in any common work, according to every man's ability and as need shall require, and we promise not to desert or leave each other or the plantation, but with the consent of the rest, or the greater part of the company who have entered into this engagement.'

It is thought that the signatories were on one of the two ships (the St John) because the group was larger than that. They were said to come from Surrey and Kent, but it is unclear how many came from Ockley.

The Pilgrim Fathers on the Mayflower had signed a similar compact in 1620 and the Guilford compact is thought to be only the second covenant.

Upon arrival in June 1639, Whitfield consulted Fenwick and Reverend John Davenport, founder of the New Haven Colony, and decided to purchase land from the Quinnipiac Native American tribe halfway between the New Haven and Saybrook colonies. Each party in the land transaction was ignorant of each other's culture. The indigenous tribal leaders likely viewed the goods that they received as a goodwill gesture from the English. Historian Richard Carlson noted that 'for the Quinnipiacs the treaties represented agreements to share uses of the land, not agreements for exclusive ownership of the land itself. This inevitable would cause problems in the future. The Quinnipiac Indians were being harried by a neighbouring tribe and presumably thought the colonists would help defend them.

The colony was named Guilford, whether after a local landowner in Kent or Guildford in Surrey (which was spelt Guilford then) is unclear.

Whitfield's house was started in September. It was not, as suggested, a copy of his Rectory in Ockley, which would have been timber framed but built of stone carted by the friendly Indians. It was a place of refuge in case of an attack, a place for church services and meetings as well as the home for the Whitfield family. It is now a museum, the oldest Stone built house in North America.

The colony prospered; the land was fertile, most of the emigrants came from farming families. One builder was noted amongst the families who was required to help the families to build the houses. Dorothy Whitfield's brother and two of her sisters were in the group. There was also a harbour, Guilford is situated on Long Island Sound, opposite Long Island which gives protection from the South and West.

But the political circumstance in England had changed. From 1642 Parliamentarians asked prominent colonists to return to England and help in the Civil War. Charles I was executed in 1649 and Oliver Cromwell became Lord Protector in 1653.

The majority of the emigrants were young men, but seven of them died between 1646 and 1648. Henry Whitfield was 57 in 1649 and asked the congregation for permission to return to England.

The congregation voted to increase his salary and offered other inducements, but he returned to England with one son in 1650. One emigrant suggested his frail body was not suited to the rigours of colonial life and the harsh winters. He was reinstated in the Church and buried in Winchester Cathedral after his death in 1657. His wife had continued living in Guilford with 5 of their 6 children who survived to adult hood until she also returned to England with two children in 1659 and died in 1669.

The link with Ockley is fairly tenuous. Rev Maurice Colins visited Guilford in the 25th year of his rectorship of Ockley in 1978. A John Steere had emigrated to Rhode Island in the 1650s and his descendants tried to research in the early 1900's where he came from, but reached no conclusion. A descendant James Steere visited Ockley and convinced himself that John came from Ockley, possibly born at Vann Farm. He paid for the erection of the plaque in St Margaret's, listing the signatures on the compact and another in memory of John Steere.

When the Church was fundraising for the repair of the Bell Frame, a party from Guilford and of Steere's were invited to visit Ockley and those whom the visitors stayed with donated the fees to the Church.

And in 2013 Ockley was represented at the 375th anniversary of the founding of Guilford by Dianne Buckley Sunda's godson, James Colgate Jerome and David Buckley, Dianne's cousin, who opened the ceremony with a speech about the 1600's colonists.

It is uncertain how many of the party came from Ockley; a search of the Church registers which began in 1539 is needed!

But every year or so we receive visitors who are descendants of the emigrants, whether from Ockley or not. Including a Congregational minister descended from Henry Whitfield who preached a few years ago.

Guilford is now a thriving community in Connecticut with a population of some 20,000 about the same as Dorking! The original farming economy was overtaken by the larger farms in the middle and West of the USA, so the economy is now basically white collar. New Haven, the location of Yale University, is some 25 Kilometres to the West on the main New York to Boston railway line, but there is a branch line along the coast to Guilford and good road communication.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY **Ringing for the King**

This time last year we were busily preparing to ring for the once-ina-lifetime event of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and here we are now getting ready to ring for our



first coronation, of King Charles III. At the time of writing plans are still vague as to timings but we would expect to be joining in a national Ring for the King at an allotted time before the ceremony and will no doubt have a few guarter peals to ring at the local churches to commemorate the event.

All ringing events are submitted to Bell board, an online record of ringing performances, and published in the Ringing World, a weekly magazine of news and events. Quarter peals are the most common form of commemoration as they require a degree of skill to achieve but only take about 45 minutes to complete whereas a full peal would take nearly 3 hours of continuous ringing and needs a lot more stamina.

The Ring for the King campaign to recruit new ringers is still attracting enquiries and has been a huge success nationally with some great coverage in news stories. In fact some areas have been inundated with learners but these are mainly in towns and cities. The shortage of ringers in rural areas continues. This means that often there are not enough ringers for the number of bells and that we are needed to ring at more than one church for Sunday Services to make up the numbers.



The Sunday a week after the Coronation, 14th May, will be Bell Sunday. This is the first of what is hoped to be an annual event to recognise the contribution of bells and bell-ringers to the life Sundoy of the Church. It may comprise a number of bell-related items,

such as readings and hymns but could also include interactive displays and demonstrations. St Dunstan is known as the Patron Saint of Bell-ringers due to his experimentation in the forging of bells in the tenth century and so Bell Sunday has been chosen to be on the Sunday closest to his feast day.

Most bellringers consider ringing to be an enjoyable hobby. It is an art which has developed and passed from generation to generation in Britain for over three hundred years and is a wonderful blend of sport, music, exercise, friendship, a challenge of wits and skill which gives great satisfaction when it goes right. Learning to ring church bells is a structured process that takes a number of one-to-one sessions to be competent at 'handling' a bell. You don't have to be a churchgoer, there is no compulsion to stay for services. While almost anyone is capable of learning to ring it is not easy and requires a lot of dedication to master. Are you up to the

challenge? You too could be taking part in this unique pastime. If you would like to find out more, please come along and see for yourself.

Practice nights at St. Margaret's, Ockley, are usually on Wednesdays from 7.45 to 9.15, but please check first.

The Garden in May & June

For many, the unseen hours we put into our green spaces begin to reap rewards in May and June. Many flowers and shrubs put on their star performances during these most eagerly awaited and treasured months in the gardening calendar. However, the prolonged low temperatures this Spring might have affected the fullness of your gardens and some of your 'stars' may have succumbed to frost. As I write this in early April, the night time temperatures are still quite low but things are warming up, albeit slowly. It's certainly a good reminder to take cuttings of tender perennials next year. We're fortunate in the South-East that in any 'normal' year, these plants survive but this year was the exception and numerous salvias, penstemons, verbena and fuchsia have been lost. Hopefully you've been able to fill the gaps without spending too much. Remember to look out for local spring shows and plant sales as this is a great value way to buy plants or consider 'swapping' plants with friends and family as clumps of perennials will often need dividing in Spring.

May and June are the perfect months to visit gardens in your local area or further afield. The RHS season kicks off with the Malvern Spring Show from the 11-14 May, and then the Chelsea Flower show is from 23-27 May. There are so many beautiful gardens to visit around the country, with Great Dixter and Sissinghurst in Kent being particular favourites. For something more local yet equally inspiring (and possibly more attainable than Chelsea!), why not visit National Garden Scheme gardens (*www.ngs.org.uk*) that are opened for charity.

In May, spring can still be very much in the air – with us enjoying the jewelled colours of late flowering tulips, rhododendrons and spring bedding – but there is definitely a promise of early summer. By the middle of May, the threat of frost has almost certainly passed and we can now plant a whole host of vegetable and flower seedlings, both under glass or outside now that the soil has warmed up. And then by June, the promise becomes a reality and summer arrives. There are always jobs to do but we must take time to enjoy the fruits of our labour. Invite friends and family to eat, drink and be merry in the spaces we've created; find a sunny spot to quietly read a good book; have a snooze in a deckchair whilst listening to the radio; or simply sit with our faces in the sun, feeling proud of all we've achieved so far.

Star plants

The star performers of May and June are too many to name but include a wide variety of clematis coming into flower - including 'Henryi', 'Etoile Violette' and 'Bourbon" - plus the colourful racemes of wisteria and laburnum that cascade over walls, pergolas and arches. Why not plant a

compact clematis, such as Cezanne or Night Veil, to climb up an obelisk? It's a perfect way to add structure, height and colour to a border. Adding an early and late flowering variety to a single obelisk is an ideal way for colour throughout the season.

There are also many cottage garden favourites that bring such variety of colour and interest to our gardens including the striking blooms of peonies and roses; the grace of aquilegia and thalictrum; the height and textural interest created by delphiniums, lupins, camassia, echinops, eryngium and the many types of allium; the colourful groundcover from the wide range of geraniums and the lime-green of alchemilla mollis (this makes a great cut flower combination with blue delphiniums): and the scent from lilac, sweetpeas, stocks, honeysuckle, lavender and philadelphus. And in between enjoying the fruits of your labour, there are always plenty to jobs.

Prepare for growth by staking and tying in tall-stemmed perennials. You can use bamboo or 'foraged' sticks but it's often worth investing in a variety of metal supports that will never need replacing. Trim and tidy up spreading plants such as allysum, arabis and aubretia. Trim them back quite hard and fresh new growth will appear. Tie in vigorous climbers regularly.

And do keep up with the weeds, which will now be trying to wreak havoc in your borders. Little and often is best, especially on dry days. Also keep an eye out for slugs, aphids and other pests, picking them out when spotted. And keep watering regularly, especially pots, preferably from a water butt and only using tap water as a last resort.

Plant It's too late for bare-root roses so go for potted ones from a good supplier. Main-crop potatoes should be planted by now and early potatoes will need earthing up. Continue successional sowing of beetroot, cabbage, carrots, salad onions, lettuce, peas, broad beans and radishes. Get tomato plants going in grow-bags in the greenhouse from the beginning of May, and by the beginning of June, you can plant them outside.

To add an extra blast of colour, in late May/early June, fill pots and hanging baskets with annuals such as petunia, impatien, trailing lobelia and begonia to name but a few. Mid to late May is often the best time to start planting out seedlings after hardening plants off outside (either in a cold frame or sheltered area) for a couple of weeks before planting them up.

Propagate by taking softwood cuttings from shrubs such as philadelphus, ribes and sambucus. Divide, replant and water clump forming spring-flowering perennials such as doronicums, pulmonarias and primula.

Prune Clematis montana and early-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering such as forsythia, kerria japonica and spiraea arguta ('straightafter-flowering' is not a bad rule to follow on shrubs in general). Lightly trim formal evergreen hedging such as box, ideally with hand shears.

And finally, we hope Saturday 12th August, is firmly in your diaries as the date for the Ockley, Okewood & Forest Green Summer Fair. This year's schedule will soon be delivered through doors and will be available from various outlets. So do look at the categories and enter your best produce to be judged by RHS judges.
