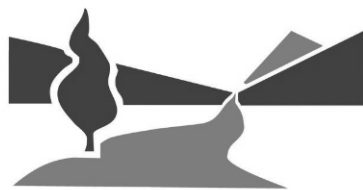

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Muffled Bells

When the sad news that the Queen had died was announced in September ringers across the country sprang into action following the protocol established in Operation London



Bridge. At Ockley the tenor was tolled half muffled 96 times at noon the day after the announcement to mark the Queen's death. There was to be no open ringing until the day after the funeral, except for the proclamation of the new King.

Open ringing is the normal sound heard when bells are rung. A muffle is a leather pad strapped to the clapper to soften the sound it makes when striking the bell. Half muffled, where only one side of each clapper is covered is heard on Remembrance Sunday and on request for local funeral services. Fully muffled ringing is very rare, reserved for the death of a monarch, when all the bell sounds are softened and less distinct.

Most towers only have one set of muffles and are not able to ring fully muffled anyway. At Ockley there was a set of very old and worn muffles in the bell chamber which had been treated with leather restoration cream some time ago with the intention of using them to patch the current set which are showing signs of wear. These proved to be serviceable enough, after rethreading with laces as their old strings had disintegrated.

Each clapper was covered with a muffle strapped on the handstroke side and then the older muffle tied around the opposite, backstroke side, in case the resulting sound was affected by the different pad thickness. The tenor was left open at backstroke, uncovered by a muffle, in accordance with the protocol, to give the effect of tolling within the muted ringing. The double muffles were then wrapped round with masking tape to prevent slippage following advice from other steeple keepers. By the time we had rung for the Sunday service and the following Wednesday practice night a couple of the muffles had moved so another visit up the tower was required to wrap them more tightly.

We rang a quarter peal on the muffled bells on the Saturday afternoon, a service ring on the Sunday, tolled for the minute's silence that evening and then rang for the hour before the funeral on the Monday.

The muffles were removed the following day and we do not expect to ring double muffled again for many years. In fact the Queen's funeral was the first time most ringers had ever rung this way and like the Jubilee ringing was a once in a lifetime experience.

Our thoughts now are towards the Coronation which will be another unique experience for most ringers. If anyone would like to take part in these celebrations please contact us as learning to ring takes time and dedication. Practice nights are at St. Margaret's in Ockley most Wednesdays from 7.45 to 9.15, but please check.

DOMESDAY BOOK

We all will have heard of 'Domesday Book' at history lessons at school, but far more is known now about its production and contents due to research.

William the Conqueror decided in 1085 that he needed to know what tax revenue he was receiving from the country. The collection of the information and its recording was a bureaucratic tour de force!

The country was feudal, meaning that everything belonged to the King who parcelled out properties (manors) to his main supporters in return for a payment or the provision of some duty. They in turn allocated the manors to various levels of inhabitants, again for payments or the provision of services.

The country was divided into 7 circuits for the collection of the information, the bureaucrats travelled round their circuit with representatives of each manor coming to report to them. The information collected differed slightly in each circuit and two circuits hadn't completed the tabulation of the information when the King died in October 1087 and work stopped. So those circuits provide slightly more information which hadn't been consolidated into the standard form.

The final document was written up by two or three people, whose handwriting can be identified separately!

Gaps had been left for the addition of information, in particularly about the major towns and cities which are under reported. And the final document was still used as a reference document for many centuries, so amendments were made!

The basic structure records the information about each county separately, with the manors held by the King listed first and then the main and subsequent landholders. Each county was subdivided into 'hundreds' and the manors held in each hundred were normally listed together. A gap was left at the end of the title of each manor so that the name of the hundred could be entered when it changed. But inevitably mistakes were made, no gap was left at the end of the Ockley manor so it was mis ascribed to Woking Hundred rather than Wootton!

Scholars have attempted to draw conclusions from the values ascribed to different manors. Some lords were more favourably treated than others, paying less. The north of England which had revolted against William in the 1060's was still showing signs of under population and the destruction caused by the 'harrowing of the North' in 1069-70. The areas in the midlands where 'Danegeld' had been paid to 'bribe' the Danes from invading and stealing crops and people also shows up as less valuable areas!

It is also surmised that the method of farming was in the process of change, with separate areas being farmed by one family being replaced by the common field system where crops rotated round the manor and the individual family farmed specific strips.

The intention of this article is to study the entries for Ockley and the immediate surrounding area! The translations are from the abbreviated Latin entries.

There are two, Hoclei (Ockley) and Arsete (Hartshurst). Hanstega (Anstie) and Dorchings (Dorking) lie to the north. Both Ockley and Hartshurst belonged to Richard the son of Count Gilbert of Tonbridge. Ockley was sub let to Ralph who held 5 other manors in Surrey. Almaer held them in the time of King Harold i.e. before the conquest). Maybe the derivation of Elmers Farm?

The details of Ockley are 1 hides, land for 4 ploughs, 9 villians with one plough, woodland for 10 pigs. In addition, Ockley has 3 borders with 4 ploughs and 2 slaves. Ockley was worth 70s. Richard himself holds $\frac{1}{2}$ a hide. Alwine held it at the time of King Harold and could go with it where he will. Then it was assessed as $\frac{1}{2}$ hide now as nothing.

While the details of Hartshurst are 2 hides, land for 4 plough, 8 villians with three ploughs, woodland for 15 pigs. Hartshurst was worth 45s. The entry ends ' This land belonged to a certain free man , and he could go with it where he pleased nor does it belong to any manor of Richard.'

Surrey was divided in 14 hundreds, it is thought each hundred contained 100 hides, but the creation of hundreds had occurred several centuries earlier and by 1086 they varied (in Surrey) from about 500 hides to 50 hides. Wotton has about 50 hides so was half a Hundred! A hide was probably an area of land but the size varied with the quality of the land! Surrey was thought to have 2,000 hides.

A plough consisted of a team of oxen, probably 8. A team could plough about 50 acres a year. It is strange that Ockley has more ploughs than plough area but Hartshurst not! Borders were thought to have sole use of an area of land, though they also had to do work for the Lord of the Manor, whether for money or by right. Villians may have had small areas as well as providing labour. Slaves were the lowest rung, though Norman practice didn't involve slaves, they were hangovers from the Saxon era.

Pigs were thought to play a large part in agriculture in the Weald, they were taken to feed on acorns and other food in the autumn. The numbers given are thought to be the number that were taxed, the actual number was thought to be 10 times as large.

The comments about ' being able to go with it where he will' shouldn't be taken literally as obviously the land cannot be moved. It is thought to

mean he could pass it on without interference from the Lord of the manor.

There is no mention of a church but churches are under recorded. St Margaret's is thought to have existed in the early 1100's.

Ockley was located around the manor house (Ockley Court) while Hartshurst is just below Leith Hill.

Dorking (Dorchinges) was 6 ½ hides and probably included what is now Holmwood and Capel. It did have a church. Westcott was 10 hides and Wootton 6, though there was woodland for 50 pigs, presumably on Leith Hill!

This is a very abbreviated essay on what is a very complicated and still disputed subject!

FIELD ARCHERY Vs. TARGET ARCHERY

We at Team Sagittarius enjoy the sport of archery and promote this relaxing and fun pastime suitable for the whole family.

Target Archery. Is the form that most folks recognise, with it being in the Olympics, shooting recurve bows with stabilisers, sights carbon or aluminium, arrows with plastic vanes for flights etc. There are many target clubs around. Usually you will find target archers shooting rounds of arrows up to 70 yards at standard bullseye style paper faces with colours of yellow, red, blue, black and white in a pleasant setting of cut grass pasture. On pleasant days the twang of bow strings and the zing of arrows are almost as common place as the sound of leather on willow. Fun for all the family who enjoy a very civilised day out.

Field Archery. This style of archery is more for the traditional of mind, set in rustic woodlands up and down the country the call of the wild can be strong when one is experiencing the thump of a heavy wooden arrow hitting its mark. The targets in this case are rubber 3D animal targets that one would of hunted back in the day. So imagine yourself in ancient woodlands on a warm summer day suddenly you see the target, a large deer in the distance through the undergrowth and under branches, you have a traditional wooden longbow and wooden arrows in your hands harking back to the days of Robin Hood, you draw an arrow from the leather quiver on your back, you place it on the string slowly drawing your bow back with no sights just pure instinct fully focused on your prey and loose!..... Well the rest is up to you.



Archery is a fun sport for all ages and really cheap, it will cost as much as you want to spend.

1. Switch on the defibrillator

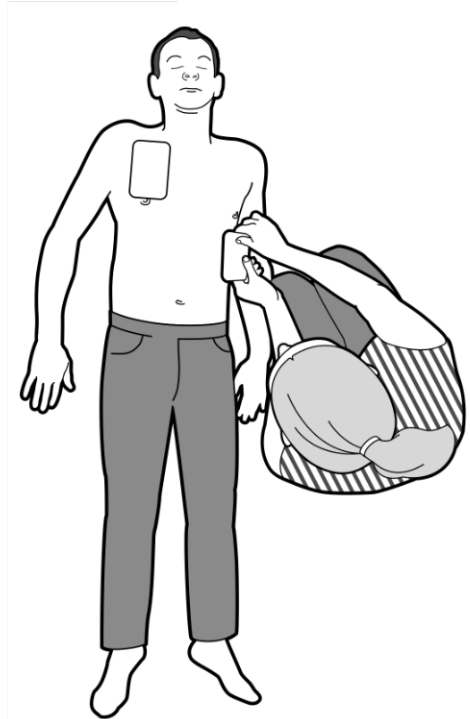
- Remove or cut through clothing and wipe away sweat from the chest if necessary
