





TAPESTRY DAY CLUB ACHIEVES CHARITABLE STATUS

This transformational milestone will allow Tapestry Day Club to provide affordable care for many more older people living with early-stage dementia and in social isolation, including those with modest means.

Tapestry Day Club – which has hosts across Surrey and West Sussex who invite guests into their family homes – has become a charity after



launching five years ago as a not-for-profit enterprise.

This significant achievement will increase the organisation's ability to provide its high-quality support and give carers – usually family members – much-needed respite time.

Co-founder Anderley Wade said: "We will be able to keep our costs down and expand our services to those who need it most. The transition became necessary after we surpassed the VAT threshold last year. We initially absorbed this additional burden, but it was unsustainable long-term. It will simplify fundraising efforts, too, granting us Gift Aid tax relief, which allows us to reclaim an extra 25% on every donation."

The migration from a community interest company (CIC) to a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) was a lengthy, complex process requiring extensive paperwork, legal assistance and the recruitment of three trustees.

Chair of trustees is eminent health-and-social-care expert Rosemary Pavoni, who has nearly 60 years of experience in this field. She ran a care home in Horsham for more than 20 years and now advises, supports and lobbies the Government on behalf of people needing social care.

"I believe passionately in ensuring that people receive the best care possible, especially those with dementia, which is why I am delighted to be chair of Tapestry Day Club," she said.

Co-founder Clare Jones announced more news: "In recognition of our new status, we have launched a brand-new website, which allows us to accept donations and work in greater collaboration with donors and funders. No donation is too small and every penny counts towards helping others financially less able to access valuable

support.

"We look forward to making a significant impact in our community and helping older people live independently for as long as possible."



About Tapestry Day Club

Dementia is something that will affect one in two of us in our lifetime. As yet, there is no cure, but it has been proven that the progress of this horrendous disease can be slowed down. That is why Tapestry Day Club was founded five years ago, to help people with dementia in Surrey and West Sussex live well and independently for as long as possible by banishing social isolation, a known factor in the progress of the illness.

We do this by enabling day care within the comfort of the family homes of Tapestry Day Club's hosts, who provide transport, a home-cooked, twocourse lunch and optional memory-boosting entertainment up to three times per week, allowing friendships to flourish.

This also gives carers – usually partners or other family members – invaluable and much-needed respite time.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY Year's End

As we approach the end of the year it is wonderful to report that we have a new member in the band. He started learning earlier this year and has been ringing for Church Services for some time now, including his first wedding.


Remembrance Sunday is on November 10th and we will be ringing on halfmuffled bells as customary from 10am ahead of the service at 10.45 and act of Remembrance at 11am. Ringing is generally considered a joyous sound associated with calling the congregation to Sunday Service and for celebrating happy events such as weddings or anniversaries. Half-muffled ringing on the other hand is a special sound for sad and solemn occasions, and this experience will be another first for our newest ringer.

The muffle is a leather pad which you may have seen in a previous item when we had ours repaired by the Cranleigh Cobbler. Each muffle is strapped to the clapper where it strikes the bell resulting in a much softer sound. Half-muffled means that the clapper is muffled on one side only, resulting in alternate loud and soft blows: all the bells sound loud for one row and then soft for the next. The result is a melancholic sound, a bit like an echo, which is also used for funerals on request as an alternative to tolling a single bell.

As this magazine also covers the festive season may we take this opportunity to wish you all A Very Happy Christmas. We are expecting to ring for the service on Christmas Day at 10am (ringing starts half an hour beforehand) but we will not be holding our usual Wednesday evening practice, much as we all love to ring. We may keep the practice on the following Wednesday though, as it will be New Year's Day, depending on individual availability.

If you would like to come and watch or have a go and perhaps learn to ring for a particular event in the future please come along and join us on a practice night. We meet on Wednesdays, 7.45 pm to 9.15 pm

In the twelve years since The Pavilion Café first opened its doors, it is proud to announce it has raised and donated more than £20,000 supporting local and national charities and Ockley groups, all thanks to its loyal customers and volunteers!

The Pavilion Café was originally the brainchild of Jenny Reed: "I was at Spring Harvest with Belinda Kerry where I attended a seminar about Christians serving the community. The next morning, I woke up and said to Belinda, 'God thinks we should start a café!' So, we formed a group of local ladies called Kindred Spirits, and we were off!

"It was important we used real coffee in china mugs and provided homemade cakes. I thought we might get a dozen or so lonely people coming, and we could knit! We provided wool, needles and sewing stuff to make fabric squares for bedcovers but, guess what? No one wanted to knit or sew, everyone just wanted to chat, drink and eat! I'm so very happy it's still going 12 years on!"

Village Greens has generously supported the café from the beginning and donates the delicious coffee, and the Kindred Spirits volunteers bake the lovely cakes, scones and quiches.

It's impossible to mention all the many worthy causes that have benefitted over the years from the generous donations, but to mention just a few ...

Donations to national charities include: Anthony Nolan Trust, Christian Aid, Crisis at Christmas, Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC), Dementia UK, Finlay's Touch, Kidney Research UK, Macmillan Cancer Support, Myra's Wells, RNLI, Stroke Association, Salvation Army.

OCKLEY HISTORY

Out of the blue (internet!) I received via the Vicar information about the Manor of Ockley.

The informant has been studying medieval ecclesiastical land holding vehicles and conveyancing.

In 787 in the charter of Offa, King of Mercia and Cynthia, his Queen, grant to Abbot Ceolnodus (Chertsey) a number of manors including the Manor of Ockley. These manors were originally granted to Erkenwaldus, Abbot and founder of Chertsey Abbey by Sheriff Frithwaldus. Chertsey Abbey was founded in 666 in the reign of King Egbert.

The grant includes:meadow; pasture; field; ponds and other water courses and was specifically for the souls of Offa's daughters.

Ockley is referred to as AEcleaht.

Less than 300 years later, Domesday Book records the manor of Ockley as owned by Almer before it was transferred to a Norman. Almer was either a common name or very powerful as he is recorded as owning 179 manors. But he did own Hartshurst, just up the hill from Ockley, and Ockham which is thought to be named after the same person, *ley* being field and *ham* being village.

The Norman owner was Ralph who held the Manor from Richard, son of Count Gilbert. Ralph maybe also be a common name as he holds land in 5 other manors in Surrey but not nearby. Richard held 32 Manors in Surrey, some directly and some delegated to others.

All the land was owned by the King, William after the conquest and Edward before (Earl Harold is mentioned rarely in Domesday Book as the Normans considered him a usurper!) and delegated in return for services. King William owned 19 manors in Surrey directly including Guildford, Kingston and Dorking (which included Capel).

Maybe the Chertsey Abbey records will record when ownership was transferred from Chertsey Abbey. I checked in the History of Surrey written by Manning and Bray published in 1809 which confirmed the founding details of Chertsey Abbey but includes a splendid note that 'Mr Salmon objects to the chronology because King Egbert was not King of England until 800. Mr Manning confirms that but says it was Egbert King of Kent in 666'. Presumably a different Egbert!

There is no mention of Ockley Manor in Chertsey's landholdings which are confirmed as continuing until King William I, when we know from Domesday Book that Ralph owned the manor.

I told the informant about the record of the battle of Ockley (851) in the Saxon Chronicle as Aclea. He referred to land dispute in 844 where the parties to the case were summoned to a synod at Aeclea which is described as praeclarus. The Anglo-Saxons called places clarus (illustrious) where a significant battle had taken place and praeclarus as most illustrious!

The land dispute relates to land in East Kent, where Beornthytha, widow of Oswulf, Earl of East Kent established her right to inherit her husband's land and give it to Christ Church (Canterbury), The location of Aeclea where the synod was held is not specified.

Were there two battles of Ockley, one before 844 and one in 851? Or was the earlier battle elsewhere?

The boundary between the Kingdoms of Mercia and Wessex were somewhat fluid in the early medieval period. Readers will recall that the battle in 851 was fought between the men of Wessex and the Vikings. The capital of Mercia had already been sacked by the Vikings as had London.

I said in the earlier article that the Vikings were thought to be going to Winchester to sack the capital of Wessex. But I have recently discovered that the capital of Wessex was at Wilton, just beyond Salisbury at that date. Wilton was sacked by the Vikings in 871 and King Alfred moved the capital to Winchester later. Alfred was born in 848!

THE FIGHT IS NOT OVER TO STOP GATWICK'S PLANS FOR A NEW RUNWAY

Communities of Sussex, Surrey and Kent, who have worked so hard to oppose a new runway at Gatwick Airport, now wait until 27th November for the official decision by the government's Planning Inspector. This recommendation will then go to the Secretary of State for Transport, the Rt Hon Louise Haigh MP, who should announce the final decision on 27th February.

"We now wait – but not in silence, as we continue to counter the Gatwick Airport's propaganda machine whilst engaging with airport management on other issues faced daily by communities" said a spokesperson for CAGNE, the umbrella aviation community and environment group.

"A new runway by private investment may initially seem attractive to the new government but, if permitted, the mess that is the applicant's noncommittal stance on surface access, air quality, carbon and amenities will undoubtably fall to the public sector to solve and fund, whilst the local communities face the adverse consequences.

"During the hearings and submissions, Gatwick management and team have shown contempt for the concerns put forward by residents, experts and local authorities. They have declined or avoided responding to the facts on key points raised – the impacts on air quality and climate change from such a vast increase in plane movements, or the lack of surface transport to take flyers, workers and freight off residential roads. They also showed utter disrespect in their attitude towards the aviation noise issues, both now and with the proposed aircraft movements of 386,000 a year," commented a spokesperson for CAGNE.

"Thanks to residents funding CAGNE, a strong team of top King's Counsel, planning barrister and solicitor, along with qualified experts in aviation noise, surface transport, air quality, climate change, waste, and sewerage, were able to meet the Gatwick team head-to-head, at each hearing and in writing, about why Gatwick Airport owners should not be allowed to go ahead with a new runway which is simply not policy.

"The airport management has continued to progress the Modernisation of Airspace (which was not permitted as part of the new runway planning hearings), and CAGNE believe they need it to meet the desired movements off a new runway. These additional changes could see many more people impacted by new flight paths due to Gatwick's desire for growth south of the airport.

"Let's be clear – we expect Gatwick to pitch communities against each other early next year when they release their planned flight paths, whether with a new runway or just the one as operated today", concluded CAGNE.
