NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

Ringling for The Platinum Jubilee

Bells are a traditional part of our heritage and St Margaret's of Ockley has a fine peal, reputed to be the oldest full set of six working bells in Surrey. The bells are tuned from D to F, with a



combined weight of 50cwt, or 2½tonnes; ranging from the smallest bell, 5cwt, known as the treble, to the heaviest, 13cwt, known as the tenor. They were cast in 1701, by Richard Phelps, an acknowledged master craftsman of the time, who also fashioned 'Great Tom' in St Paul's Cathedral.

In 1981 the original timber bell frame had deteriorated to a dangerous degree and a major fundraising effort was needed to meet the cost of restoration. A new steel frame was made while the bells were returned to the Whitechapel foundry. The treble was recast and the other five were turned by a sixteenth to reduce the wear at the point the clapper strikes.

The Ringing World is a weekly news magazine covering all aspects of ringing. It often contains reports of bell restoration projects and there have been a few cases of note recently involving older bells. Bells are tuned when cast to sound not only to a particular note but within a scale that fits with the rest of the circle of bells. Sometimes permission is sought to retune the bells as part of the work, to improve the sound of the peal and lately some have been refused because the sound is part of their history and should not be changed.

It is sobering to think that the sound of the bells ringing at Ockley has been the same for over 300 years and when installed they would have been the loudest sound to be heard in the area. There would have been no competition from aircraft, motor vehicles, farm and garden machinery or even steam engines. The only other loud sounds would have been from the occasional thunder storm, cannon fire (unlikely!) or from a musket or other use of gunpowder. Even a single chime bell is not as loud as a bell swung full circle. Capel had one, dated 1605 which is now the number 4 within St John's ring of 6, the others being added from Victorian times, and later.

Ringing church bells is very rewarding, combining a physical and social activity with the mental exercise of keeping your bell in the right place. Practically anyone can learn to ring, from the age of 10 upwards, and one to one training is freely given though it takes commitment to become accomplished. Anyone wanting to come along and have a go, under supervision, or just watch, is most welcome. Practice nights are on Wednesdays from 7.45 to about 9pm.

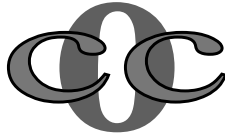

THE GARDEN IN EARLY AUTUMN

As we move into autumn, the days will be drawing in, and the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness is very much upon us. Whilst for some, it can be a wistful time, for many it's a favourite season. Nature displays an intense and striking pallet of colours - russet, orange, amber and scarlet - set against the mellow, hazy and often romantic backdrop created by the low sun (a perfect time to get the camera out!)

Over the coming weeks, look out for all those shrubs and trees that put on a particularly impressive show with striking foliage, hips and berries - liquidambar and acer; Cotinus and cotoneaster; Virginia creeper, crab apples, rosa rugosa and Amelanchier to name but a few.

Plant spring flowering bulbs like narcissi, iris, and crocus now but wait until colder November for tulips (to help avoid the fungal disease 'tulip fire').

Plant garlic and finish planting autumn onion sets for a crop in early to mid-summer next year and plant garlic cloves. Get a head start by sowing sweet peas under cover in a cold greenhouse or cold frame.

Before frosts set in, October can be an ideal month for moving and planting trees, shrubs and climbers, as well as for hedge planting. And the ground is more moist, **divide** perennials that have grown too large and move to gaps in your borders or swap with gardening friends.

Harvest pumpkins and squashes, and the last of the beetroot and carrots. And pick apples before the frosts begin. If you have a surplus, why not deliver unwanted apples to a cider maker for a bottle or two of the finished product? And always leave a few on your lawn for ground feeding birds to enjoy.

Prune roses lightly after they have finished flowering, taking off the tall top growth to protect them from 'wind rock' (then properly prune in spring).

Take hardwood cuttings. Ideal shrubs include Buddleia, Weigela, Ligustrum (privet), Philadelphus, Forsythia and Willow. Have a go and see if you can create some 'plants for free'!

Prepare and mulch your beds. October is a great month for digging over areas of the garden or vegetable plot, adding organic (peat free!) compost or well-rotted manure. The approaching cold weather will break down large clumps into crumbly particles and improve the soil.

If you are leaving your dahlias in over winter, make sure to put a protective layer of compost over each plant. Otherwise dig the tubers up and store them in soil or sand in a dark place.

Plants of the Month

Dahlias - with their myriad forms and colours - can continue to flourish well into October. Try popular 'Bishop Llandaff' with its striking red blooms; or 'Fascination' for its pink florets and bronze foliage; or 'Bantling' for striking orange pompoms. And we must mention the cheerful purples, warming pinks and bright whites of the Asters: a familiar waymark for the move from early to mid-autumn.

Our 'Coarse Cricket Sevens' competition

Last year we moved the event from a Sunday to Saturday to coincide with Ockley Cricket Club's, end of season evening celebrations and BBQ. That seemed to work well so we are repeating this year.

What is Coarse Cricket?

We bring together six teams of seven for a day of fun cricket. The village green is decked out with a marquee, refreshments are available throughout the day, excellent lunches are provided and the adjacent pavilion opens it's bar.

The rules are fairly straight forward and include:

Teams of seven, and this year three of whom can be a 'proper' cricketer (playing for the 1st or 2nd XI). The team must include at least one women member.

The match consists of one innings of six overs.

Each member of the fielding team (except the wicket keeper) bowls one over.

Each member of the batting team remains at the crease until declared 'out' or else reaches 22 runs, whereupon they retire.

FARMING CHANGES OVER 50 YEARS

There are rapid changes happening to farming now. The price of wheat trebled because of the invasion of Ukraine; it has come back slightly but is still over twice what it was a year ago. But the price of fertiliser went up by 600% but even at that price the increase in yield justifies it's use.

Meanwhile the subsidy schemes for farmers are being skewed more towards protection of the environment rather than food production. It is likely we will be growing 50% of the area of crops we have recently at Jayes, with the remainder growing food for wildlife.

The same crop cannot be grown in the same field year after year because of the build-up of disease, weeds and pests, so a 'break' crop of another species is needed. The profitability of break crops is less than the subsidy to be paid for the environmentally beneficial crops.

The dairy at Eversheds was let some years ago to Dan Laker who also farms at Beare Green. The cost of feed he buys in has increased while he is also affected by the increase in the price of fertiliser and fuel. The price he gets for his milk has increased but not enough to cover the cost increases!

And then we have the drought!

Meanwhile farming has already changed dramatically over the 50 years I have been involved. If Jeremy Clarkson had been making a programme 50 years ago it would have been very different.

The crops grown are similar, grass, wheat, barley and oats but there was no oil seed rape (grown combine for oil) and little maize. Vegetables were grown but not on the field scale as now though not in our area of Surrey!

Grass was grazed or made into hay as winter fodder. The making of grass silage was in its infancy, though I did find papers my father collected in the 1930's for grass drying!

The first tractor came to Jayes in 1947, up to then cart horses had been used. A combined harvester for grain crops arrived in the 1950's though initially it was not self-propelled. Until the tractor came the wheat cut by a horse drawn implement and bound into sheaves. Later a tractor towed 'reaper and binder' was used. The sheaves were loaded onto wagons and stacks built, thatched with straw like the ones in Monet's impressionist paintings though they were haystacks! During the winter a threshing machine came to separate the grain from the straw. All very labour intensive.

Now a 'combined harvester' cuts the fields at a speed of acres an hour, the grain is loaded into trailers to be taken to the grain store and the straw is baled. A combine may cut 2000 acres or more in a year, and they are very



large! Because the A29 from Beare Green was closed for resurfacing, the combine had to come through the railway bridge on Coles Lane and it only just fitted (see photograph).

The method of cultivation has also changed. After the horse drawn plough came the tractor drawn one. But in both cases the ploughed land was left to weather (ideally a frost) to break down the soil into a tilth fine enough from planting. Horse drawn and early tractor drawn cultivation implements were light and many passes would be needed to cultivate a tilth. Gradually the implements got heavier and the tractors more powerful.

The heavy clay land can be very wet in winter and bake to an impenetrable pan in summer, in the 60's and 70's a programme

of under-drainage was undertaken to remove the excess water to the streams. Similar schemes had been carried out in the Victorian era by hand with teams of mostly Irishmen when they weren't building the railways! 50 years ago large self-propelled trenchers were used, occasionally the drainage pipes were 'towed' in with a mole plough.

Recently these intensive schemes of cultivation have been replaced by minimum till systems or direct drilling. The soil is not inverted and only the surface is cultivated to make the tilth. This lessens the release of carbon from the soil and fewer worms are disturbed and they help create the tilth for the plant to grow. This is only possible if the soil hasn't formed pans of impenetrable layers, which can be created by heavy machinery used when soil conditions aren't right, and machines and tractors are fitted with wide or even twin tyres to decrease the ground pressure.

The large tractors and machinery are very expensive and need to be used over large areas, so farm sizes have increased and agricultural contractors who cultivate areas for many owners are the norm.

I will write a further article about dairy farming for a future magazine!

Target Archery. 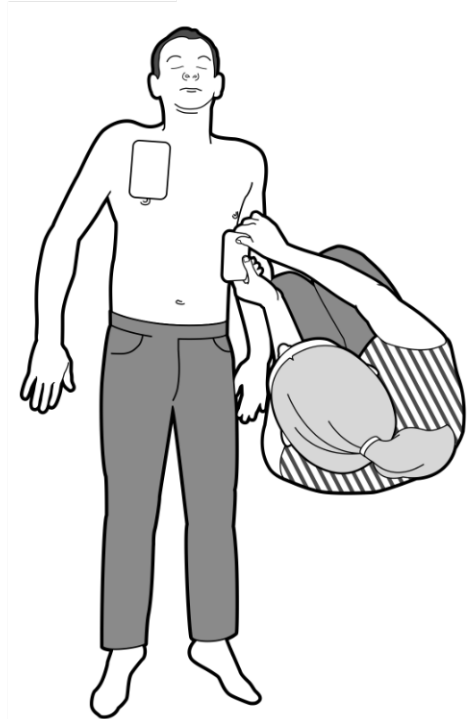
HOW TO USE A DEFIBRILLATOR
