DO YOU KNOW THE HISTORY OF THE FLOWER SHOW?

The very first area flower show aim was to encourage the cultivation of flowers, fruit and vegetables by means of exhibitions and prizes. We are now celebrating 118 years of splendid Showmanship!

1893 The flower show originated, following the creation of a horticultural society for the parishes of Ockley, Capel and Newdigate. The first President was William Calvert of Ockley Court.

Prizes were awarded for garden produce, the best kept and cropped garden, honey and for collections and arrangements of wildflower and bouquets.

There were categories of prizes for amateurs; for those working under gardeners and for cottages.

The Horticultural Committee appointed the judges.

August 16th, 1893 The first show was held in the meadows behind the Capel Churchyard. There were 300 exhibits in 4 tents.

1894 The show schedule was extended to include drawing and woodworking.



1896 More than 1000 people visited the show.

1897 Sports events were added for children

1899 Handicrafts were encouraged. Janet and Eva Lee-Steere had started the Oakwood Hill Show.

1902 Other parishes wanted to be included and it was decided that Ockley would hold its own show and later decided to join Oakwood Hill Show.



The 1920s Ockley people could send in their entries on a cart left at The Kings Arms in Ockley at 8 a.m. sharp on the morning of the day.

The show alternated between Oakwood Hill and Ockley (the Ockley Village Hall's Lion Pistol Field).

1940-1946 No shows were held during the War.



By **1973** the show settled into the pattern of being held on the 3rd Saturday of August at Oakwood Hill (later moved to the 2nd Saturday of August).

1973 to present Many additional cups and prizes were donated by supporters and families to increase the annual awards, including awards for children. One such cup is the Quentin Blake Children's Poet Laureate Award and signed Quentin Blake books for art entries.

The number of volunteers sustained the continued expansion of events, including the road race for all ages and the fun dog show.

The show schedule continues to be professionally produced, aiming to announce all of the classes, sports, dog show events, food courts, entry forms and contacts for enquiries.

2016 200 classes were on display in the marquee.

Ann Clary, a show committee member was honoured for 50 years of volunteer service.

The chairman and show committee welcomed all to the 118th Show.

The show president awarded Dr. Briony Thomas the President's Award for her contribution of flower show history.

In its 2nd year, this is a celebration of everything that is good about the countryside. Knepp is the Sussex home of rewilding and host of the event positioned alongside their kitchen garden and restaurant.

This year there will be a wonderful array of stalls, activities and demonstrations, including events for youngsters and adults. There will be talks and tours of Knepp by experts in a multitude of fields all connected to the countryside. The event maintains a strict ethos to the planet, nature and the wellbeing benefits the countryside brings to us all.

The event is organised by the Sussex branch of the national charity Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) that seeks to protect and promote the countryside for today and future generations.

This year the national charity head office is to set CPRE Countryside Day as an annual event. Other regional branches are seeking to roll out events to celebrate the countryside such as walks, talks, and smaller events.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY Change Ringing

When ringing changes the bells strike in different orders to the rounds of 1-2-3-4-5-6 and this is achieved by altering the speed at which the bells swing. Bell mechanics limit the amount of variance, especially with a heavy bell so movement is mostly restricted to one place at a time,

where adjacent pairs of bells swap places. It's a bit like people walking one behind the other, one speeds up and the other slows down in order to switch position, while still moving in the same direction.

The ringer still needs to strike the bell accurately each row but must also think about the position of the bell – 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc., and what place to move to in the next row, as well as any change of speed required to get there. Moving a place forward requires you to ring quicker by catching the sally earlier or shortening the tail end of the rope and conversely, moving a place back will need a firmer preceding pull to hold the bell up to wait.



There are broadly two types of change ringing; call changes, where the order is changed periodically by a conductor calling the changes to swap 2 bells in a row and methods, where the order changes continually according to an established pattern. Method ringing is much more dynamic because all of the bells involved change places most of the time

'Plain Hunt' is the first basic step in learning to ring methods and the treble is sometimes the only bell to plain hunt in more complicated methods. This basic method involves moving the bell continuously in one direction, for example, 'Hunting Up', the bell will strike one place later each time, moving, say, from 1st place to 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place and then 'Hunting Down' again striking one place earlier each time until back in first place. Meanwhile all the other bells will carry out similar movements, the even placed bells hunting down and the odd placed hunting up, in order to continually swap places, until they have all 'Come Round' to their original position.

THE GARDEN IN EARLY AUTUMN

Well, it's been another strange year weather-wise, too much rain in May and June affected much of the garden and in July and early August there were high temperatures and more rain! Now, as we move into autumn, the days will be getting shorter and it's the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, harvesting the last of the fruit such as apples (although our apples didn't do very well this year) and autumn raspberries. For many it's a favourite season, with autumn colours - russet, orange, amber and scarlet - set against the mellow, hazy backdrop created by the low sun, it's the perfect time to get out into the beautiful Surrey Hills on our doorstep.

Over the coming weeks, look out for all those shrubs and trees that put on a particularly impressive show - liquidambar and acer; Cotinus and cotoneaster; and especially Virginia creeper.

Plant spring flowering bulbs like narcissi, iris, and crocus now but wait until colder November for tulips (to help avoid the fungal disease 'tulip fire'). Plant garlic and finish planting autumn onion sets for a crop in early to mid-summer next year.

Before frosts set in, October can be an ideal month for moving and planting trees, shrubs and climbers, as well as for hedge planting. And if the ground is moist, divide perennials that have grown too large and move to gaps in your borders or swap with gardening friends.

Harvest pumpkins and squashes, and the last of the beetroot and carrots.

Prune roses lightly after they have finished flowering, taking off the tall top growth to protect them from 'wind rock' (then properly prune in spring).

Take hardwood cuttings from Buddleia, Weigela, Ligustrum (privet), Philadelphus, Forsythia and Willow. Have a go and see if you can create some 'plants for free'!

Prepare and mulch your beds. October is a great month for digging over areas of the garden or vegetable plot, adding organic (peat free!) compost or well-rotted manure. The approaching cold weather will break down large clumps into crumbly particles and improve the soil.

If you are leaving your dahlias in over winter, make sure to put a protective layer of compost over each plant. Otherwise dig the tubers up and store them in soil or sand in a dark place.

Plants of the Month

Dahlias are a favourite of ours - with their myriad forms and colours, continuing to flower well into October. There is 'Bishop Llandaff' with its striking red blooms; or 'Fascination' with its pink florets and bronze foliage; or 'Bantling' with its striking orange pompoms. And we must mention the cheerful purples, warming pinks and bright whites of the Asters: a familiar waymark for the move from early to mid-autumn.

And finally, a belated "well done" to all those who entered fruit, veg or flowers in this year's Okewood, Ockley and Forest Green Summer Fair and Flower Show, and congratulations to those that won a prize. The horticultural element of the show has been there from the start in 1893 and is still at its heart today. It is never too early to start thinking about what to 'grow and show' for next year, so start planning and happy gardening.

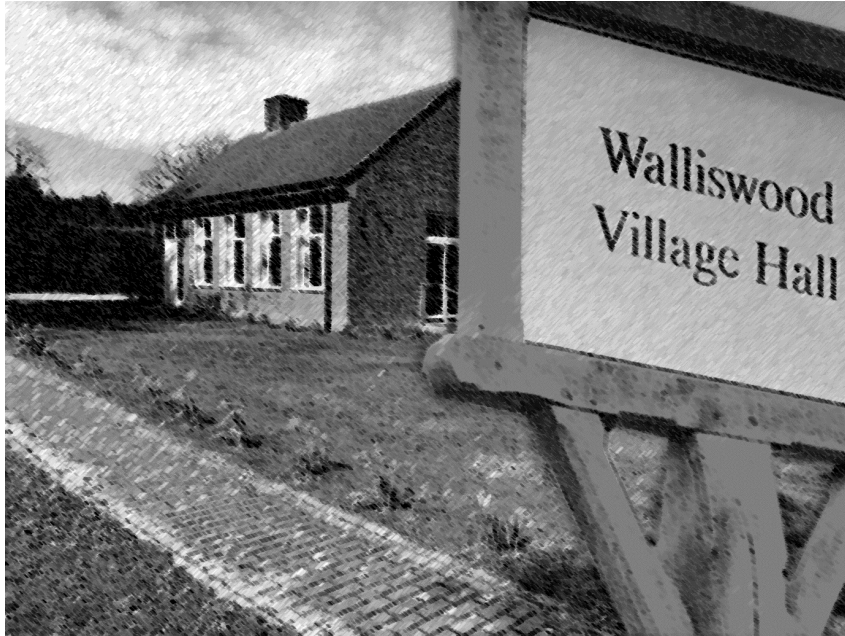

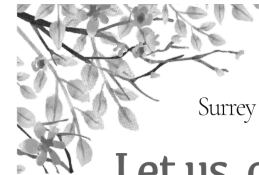
